Executive Summary

In February 2020, the eight- year term of Dr. Elsa P. Manarpaac as the Second President of Western Philippines University ended. Evidently, she had achieved most of her dreams for the University: promoting the accreditation of programs to higher level; revitalizing research, development and extension services; modernizing infrastructure; and invigorating administrative and support services.

In 2020, the four-year term of Dr. Julie Hope Timotea P. Evina as the Third President of the University commenced when she sworn into office on February 18, 2020. It is her dream for WPU to soar to greater heights by harnessing opportunities for progress and excellence. She believes that this can be achieved through the following development goals: Attain academic excellence; Continuous upgrading of facilities; Sustain implementation of human resource development programs; Sustain advocacy for green initiatives among faculty, staff and students; Sustain prominence in research, innovation, and extension towards sustainable development; Preparing to move towards Industry 4.0; and Achieving AmBisyon 2040 through higher education.

Academic Affairs

- WPU maintains its seven colleges namely: College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), College of Agriculture, Forestry and Environmental Sciences (CAFES), College of Business and Management (CBM), College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE), College of Education (CEd), College of Engineering and Technology (CET), and College of Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences (CFAS).
- WPU offers three doctorate degrees, eight master's degrees, 20 undergraduate degrees, one post baccalaureate and two pre baccalaureate. Some of the programs are offered in external campuses.
- During AY 2020-2021, some of the degree programs being offered at the Main Campus were evaluated by the AACUP Accreditors through online. For the year 2020, there were eight programs accredited to the next higher level. The results of the accreditation showed that nine programs were Level 1 Accredited; 13 were Level 2 Re-accredited; nine were Level 3 Re-accredited; and two were Level 4 Re-accredited.
- As to the enrollment for the First Semester of AY 2020-2021, 9,618 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 619 in the graduate and eight in the post-baccalaureate with a total of 10, 237 enrollees. While for the Second Semester of AY 2020-2021, 8,834 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 555 in the graduate and 11 in the post baccalaureate with a total of 9,400.

- The enrollment trend for the last five years shows that in the undergraduate, the enrollment in 2016 was 5,932 and 4,941 in 2017. The enrollment in the two successive years declined due to the implementation of the K to 12 Curriculum where the graduates of Junior High School are required to go through Senior High School before they can proceed to college. The enrollment increased again to 6,902 in 2018 and 8,821 in 2019. This is because the first batch of graduates of the Senior High School started to enroll in college. In the graduate, the enrollment ranged from 271 to 587.
- The number of graduates from 2016 to 2019 ranged from 1,183 to 1,377 in the undergraduate. However, in 2020, it fell dramatically to 756 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. In the graduate, it ranged from 10 to 27.
- As to the number of students who benefited from the different scholarship grants in the University in 2020, a total of 1,575 students during the First Semester and 1,460 during the Second Semester were beneficiaries of the Tertiary Education Subsidy (TES) while a total of 217 students during the First Semester and 211 during the Second Semester were recipients of the TES-Tulong Dunong Program (TES-TDP) grant. TES and TES-TDP are grants from the Commission on Higher Education. There was also one beneficiary of CHED Scholarship Program (CSP) during the first and second semester.
- In 2020, the Guidance and Counseling Services Section had rendered services to a total of 10,367 clients.
- A total of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (P1, 500,000.00) was allocated for Student Assistants. Student Assistants render services at twenty-five (P25.00) pesos per hour but not to exceed one hundred hours per month. Before the pandemic in 2020, a total of fifty-eight (58) students availed of the Student Assistantship Program of the University. They were assigned in different colleges/ departments/ sections.
- The Student Handbook was revised in 2020. It was approved by the Board of Regents on February 17, 2020 through Board Resolution Number 576 series of 2020 at the CHED Conference Room, Office of the Commissioner, 4/F HEDC Building, C.P. Garcia Avenue, UP Diliman, Quezon City.
- WPU hosted the 16th Regional Higher Education Press Conference (RHEPC) in coordination with Regional Association of MIMAROPA Press Advisers, Incorporated (RAMPA) and Commission on Higher Education on February 5-7, 2020 held at the WPU-Training Center.
- The Health Services Division serves the university by providing assistance to the WPU students, faculty and staff. In 2020, it provided medical, dental, and nursing services to the WPU community and some private individuals.

- At the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, the libraries launched online library services that cater to both on and off-campus clientele, namely: Library Online Reference Assistance (LORA), a library assistance that caters library users through online platforms (Facebook, Messenger and Gmail); Library Phone Reference Assistance (LiPRA), a library assistance that caters to the needs of users through mobile phone; and Document Delivery Service (DDS), a library service that delivers photocopied and scanned materials (soft copy). It has crafted its WPU Library Strategic Plan for 2020-2025 and initiated online activities such as WPU Live National Book Week Celebration was streamed on November 23- 27, 2020 via Facebook; Online Orientation on October 22-23, 2020; Training - Workshop on Basic Cataloging and Circulation of Library Materials using the Destiny Library Manager on October 1-2, 2020 at the Main Library; Training on the New WPU Library @ the New Normal on August 14, 2020, via Zoom; and Gift Giving Outreach Activity on January 25, 2020 to pupils at Tatandayan Elementary School at Barangay Imulnod, Brooke's Point, Palawan. In pursuit of its commitment to excellence, the library established the Library Attendance System in three Libraries: Main Library, Puerto Princesa City Campus Library, and Quezon Campus Library. The system aimed to automate the acquisition and generation of reports for the easy monitoring of clients and preparation of statistics.
- In pursuit of its commitment to excellence, the library established the Library Attendance System in three Libraries: Main Library, Puerto Princesa City Campus Library, and Quezon Campus Library. - The University maintains two performing arts groups - the WPU Himigayaw at the Main Campus and the WPU-PPC Performing Arts Troupe in WPU Puerto Princesa City Campus. During the First Semester of AY 2020-2021, the total number of members was 25 and the same number of members was maintained during the Second Semester. The Performing Arts Groups had rendered performances during the different activities of the University.
- A total of 28 WPU students Batch 2019-2020, taking up agriculture and other agriculture-related programs who took their OJT in Israel arrived in the country by batch on October 14, 21 and 24, 2020.
- MOA signing between WPU and University of Baguio for collaboration on BS in Criminology was done on January 27, 2020 at Baguio Golf Country Club, Baguio City.
- A series of Training-Workshops on Preparation of Instructional Modules and the Use of Google Classroom and Edmodo at WPU Training Center and Information Technology Services Office, WPU Main was held on July 20-25, 2020 and August 3-5, 2020 and in Puerto Princesa City on July 27-August 1, 2020. This training-workshop was conducted to provide the faculty with sufficient knowledge and skills they needed in the development of their own instructional modules.

- The AACCU Online Capability Training of WPU Internal Quality Assurance Team was held at the WPU Training Center, Aborlan Campus on September 9-11, 2020. The Western Philippines University and the Cotabato Foundation College of Science and Technology were the first institutions to go for the online capability training for the Internal Quality Assurance Team.

Research and Development

- As envisioned to be the leading knowledge center for sustainable development of West Philippines and beyond, WPU also achieved excellence in the field of research. In 2020, it has come up with 53 internally funded projects. It had 21 publications and several paper presentations of which six papers were presented in international fora, one in national, three in regional and six in local levels.
- Articles published in The Palawan Scientist are now indexed in the Web of Science. Web of Science is an online subscription-based scientific citation indexing service originally produced by the Institute for Scientific Information, later maintained by Clarivate Analytics, that provides a comprehensive citation search.

Extension Services

- On the Extension Services, WPU has 22 projects approved by the Board of Regents. In 2020, through the seven colleges, it had 115 trainings and trained 2,797.75 trainees weighted by the length of training.

Administration and Support Services

- The total budget of WPU in 2020 was Php 248,339,881.18. The budget allocated for Personal Services (PS) was Php 204,785,497.02, for Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) was Php 18,466,195.16 and for Capital Outlay was Php 25,088,189.00.
- For the Calendar Year 2020, the Western Philippines University had three projects categorized as agriculture-based projects, non-agriculture-based projects and auxiliary projects. There were three sub-projects under the agriculture-based projects, namely: crops project, animal project and agri-fishery project. The Income Generating Projects and Auxiliary Projects earned a gross income of PhP 3,670,782.55 with a net income of PhP 928,445.9.
- There was a total of 328 faculty members and 316 staff members who composed the university workforce in 2020. As to the status of employment of faculty, 194 were permanent, 40 were temporary, one was substitute, 77 were contract of service and 16 were part time. For the status of employment of the staff, 126 were permanent, two were temporary, two were contractual, ten were casual, twenty-six were contract of service and 150 were job order/emergency laborers.

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About the University

Brief History

Western Philippines University traces its history back to 1910 when the American teachers, the Thomasites, founded the Aborlan Farm Settlement School for the Tagbanuas, one of the indigenous groups in the province of Palawan. Only after six years of its establishment did its doors open to non-Tagbanuas. Its focus on agriculture led to its conversion to Aborlan Agricultural High School (AAHS) in 1928. It offered subjects such as Farm Arithmetic, Field Work, and Horticulture. It also offered Literature, Composition, and Physical Education. Eventually, in 1960, the AAHS was converted into a national regional agricultural school and became known as the Palawan National Regional Agricultural School (PNRAS) by virtue of RA 2619.



Since PNRAS served largely the province of Palawan, it was renamed Palawan National Agricultural School (PNAS) in 1962. A year after, on June 22, 1963, PNAS was converted into the Palawan National Agricultural College (PNAC) by virtue of RA 3648. Its conversion authorized PNAC to offer courses leading to associate degrees in agriculture and agricultural education, bachelor degrees in agriculture, agricultural education, home economics, and also Master of Science with majors in agricultural sciences and Master of Agricultural Education.



It was during this time when PNAC established the internationally awarded Bayanihan School Program, a recipient of the *Pro Patria Award* and the *Ramon Magsaysay Award*, in recognition of the services it rendered to more than 2,000 out of school youth and farmers through the Bayanihan Centers in Barong-barong, Abo-abo, Calasaguen, and Samariñana in Brooke's Point; Magsaysay and San Jose in Dumarang; Bucana, Sibaltan, and Teneguiban in El Nido; Candawaga in Rizal; Antipuluan, Princess

Urduja, Calategas, and Malatgao in Narra; Salvacion in Puerto Princesa City; Aramaywan, Quinlogon, and Tagusao in Quezon; Mendoza and San Jose in Roxas; and Abongan, Busybees, and Magsaysay in Taytay. These Bayanihan Centers were the forerunners of the present national high schools in the said areas.

Palawan National Agricultural College was converted to State Polytechnic College of Palawan (SPCP) on May 25, 1995 by virtue of RA 8012. It further authorized SPCP to offer other courses in arts, sciences and technology, and other courses that are consistent with local, regional, and national development. On March 5, 2004, SPCP was



converted to a full-fledged university with the enactment of RA 9260 and became Western Philippines University (WPU). More relevant courses were offered; professional development of its faculty and staff was revitalized; and new and stronger linkages with partner institutions were established.

In 2013, WPU was recognized by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACUP), Inc. as one of the Top Performing SUCS based on the number of programs awarded accreditation status by levels.

In 2015, in recognition of its environmental advocacy, WPU won awards from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and Commission on Higher Education. The University was a National Finalist and declared Regional Winner in the National Search for Sustainable and Eco-friendly Schools in MIMAROPA Region (Tertiary Level) and also received the MERALCO Energy Leadership Award- the same awards it previously won in 2013, 2015 and 2017 and Nestle Water Leadership Award- the same award it won in 2017. In 2017, WPU was finally recognized as a national winner for grabbing the Second Place in the nationwide competition. In 2019, WPU received the award “2019 Most Sustainable and Eco-Friendly School for MIMAROPA.



Major milestones were achieved when Puerto Princesa City Campus was designated as a Center of Excellence in Fisheries and as a National College/University of Fisheries (NUCF) while the Main Campus was designated as National College/University of Agriculture (NUCA). WPU was also designated as Regional Center for Information and Communications Technology, Regional Center for Vermiculture and Vermimeal Production, Affiliated Renewable Energy Center (AREC) and Provincial Center for Human Rights Education by the Commission on Higher Education and Commission on Human Rights.

WPU has gone a long way in its more than one hundred years of existence. From being a humble farm settlement school in 1910, WPU has evolved into a prime mover, a leader, in sustainable development in Western Philippines and beyond through relevant instruction, research, and extension services. Its name has become synonymous with environmental protection and green technology, enabling more people to lead a better life.




WPU Organizational Structure

Areas of Service

The Main Campus of Western Philippines University is located in Aborlan, Palawan. It has a major campus in Puerto Princesa City which offers courses in fisheries and aquatic biology. In response to requests from local government units to provide higher education to their constituents, WPU established campuses in Quezon (2003), Busuanga (2003), Culion (2003) and El Nido (2004). There are two extension schools: Rio Tuba in Bataraza (2004) and Canique in Taytay (2011); three training centers: Quinlogan in Quezon, Calasaguen in Brooke's Point, and Mangingisda in Puerto Princesa City; and one marine research station in Binduyan, Puerto Princesa City.






Enrollment and Graduation Trends


As to the enrollment for the First Semester of AY 2020-2021, 9,610 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 619 in the graduate and eight in the post- baccalaureate with a total of 10, 237 enrollees. While for the Second Semester of AY 2020-2021, 8,834 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 555 in the graduate and 11 in the post- baccalaureate with a total of 9,400. It is shown that the enrollment during the second semester decreased by 837.

Student Welfare Services

Student Development Services

The Student Development Program are set of programs and activities designed for the enhancement and deepening of leadership skills and social responsibility which include Student Organization and Activities, Professional Organizations and societies, special interests, Leadership Training Programs, Student Council/Government, Student Discipline and Student Publication/media.

Institutional Services Handled by OSAS

The Career Center

The Career Center has nine (9) major services namely: Academe-Industry Partnerships, Career Counseling and Advising, Testing, Job Placement Services, Career-Related Seminars, Career Volunteerism, Career and Job Fairs/PEOS, E-Portfolio, and Advisory Board Meetings. The Career Center prepares students from their first year to their last years and beyond, to ensure that they are educated on their strengths, weaknesses, and career options.

Meanwhile, the Job Placement Office takes the students' preparedness further by ensuring that the students have labor market information (LMI), job opportunities, and knowledge on employment laws and regulations at their fingertips. It maintains sixteen (16) services in partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment-Special Program for Employment of Students (SPES), Phil-JobNet, Job Fair, PESO Employment Information System (PEIS), Pre-Employment Orientation Seminars (PEOS), Special Recruitment Activity (SRA), Government Internship Program (GIP), Local Recruitment Activity (LRA), Tulong Panghanap sa Ating Disadvantaged/Displaced Worker (TUPAD), Livelihood, National Skills Registry Program, Tulong Alalay sa Mga Taong May Kapansanan Program (Tulay), Pre-Departure Orientation Seminar (PDOS)m Jobstart, Anti-Child Labor, and Anti-Illegal Recruitment and Trafficking in Persons (AIR-TIP).

Scholarship

The scholarship unit provides clients with information on the different services, requirements, procedures, fees and timeline; and implements policies and regulations on students' scholarships and grants. It provides opportunity for students to meet costs of education through scholarships and financial assistance. The goals and objectives of the scholarship section are: to assist students who generally belong to "poor but deserving" group to find ways and means of financial support through scholarships and grants for educational purposes; to scout for possible scholarship grantors (private and government) to deserving students.

Library Services

At the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, the libraries launched online library services that cater to both on and off-campus clientele, namely: Library Online Reference Assistance (LORA), a library assistance that caters library users through online platforms (Facebook, Messenger and Gmail); Library Phone Reference Assistance (LiPRA), a library assistance that caters to the needs of users through mobile phone; and Document Delivery Service (DDS), a library service that delivers photocopied and scanned materials (soft copy).

To be aligned with the direction of the University, the library conducted a Training- Workshop on the Conduct of Library Performance Review and Strategic Planning Targets Formulation: A Bottom-Up Approach on December 17-18, 2020. The output of this workshop is the Library Strategic Plan for 2020-2025. Nineteen library personnel from WPU external campuses attended the activity at the WPU Puerto Princesa City Campus Library.

The first WPU Live National Book Week Celebration was streamed on November 23- 27, 2020 via Facebook. Various activities were conducted to entice library users to patronize the library services and promote and instill the value of information services to the community even in the time of the pandemic.

The library participated in the University-wide Online Orientation on October 22-23, 2020. During this event, the University Librarian was able to present the new online library services.

In preparation for the digitization of resources and upgrading of services, the library initiated two trainings for the library personnel: (1) Training - Workshop on Basic Cataloging and Circulation of Library Materials using the Destiny Library Manager on October 1-2, 2020 at the Main Library and (2) Training on the New WPU Library @ the New Normal on August 14, 2020, via Zoom.

As part of its Outreach Services, the library organized a Gift Giving Activity on January 25, 2020, at Tatandayan Elementary School at Barangay Imulnod, Brooke's Point, Palawan. Pupils were given slippers and school supplies and participated in the library's feeding program.

Due to the pandemic, the acquisition of materials was also affected. Only 417 books (volume) were acquired by WPU Libraries and most of them were donation. On the other hand, the library disposed 280 obsolete periodicals and donated 72 books to external campuses.

In pursuit of its commitment to excellence, the library established the Library Attendance System in three Libraries: Main Library, Puerto Princesa City Campus Library, and Quezon Campus Library. The system aimed to automate the acquisition and generation of reports for the easy monitoring of clients and preparation of statistics.

Performing Arts Groups

The University maintains two performing arts groups - the WPU Himigyaw at the Main Campus and the WPU-PPC Performing Arts Troupe in WPU Puerto Princesa City Campus. During the First Semester of AY 2020-2021, the total number of members was 25 and the same number of members was maintained during the Second Semester. The Performing Arts Groups had rendered performances during the different activities of the University.



As envisioned to be the leading knowledge center for sustainable development of West Philippines and beyond, WPU also achieved excellence in the field of research. In 2020, it has come up with 53 internally funded studies. It had 21 publications and several paper presentations of which six papers were presented in international fora, one in national, three in regional and six in local levels.

The Palawan Scientist, an open-access, refereed research journal of WPU, released its 12th Volume in July, 2020. It is an externally peer-reviewed multi-disciplinary journal published by the Western Philippines University, Aborlan, Palawan, Philippines. It aims to publish high quality and original researches in the fields of agriculture, fisheries and aquatic sciences, environment, education, engineering, mathematics, sociology and related disciplines (to include arts and humanities). Articles published in The Palawan Scientist are now indexed in the Web of Science. Web of Science is an online subscription-based scientific citation indexing service originally produced by the Institute for Scientific Information, later maintained by Clarivate Analytics, that provides a comprehensive citation search.






