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About the University

Brief History

Western Philippines University traces its history back to 1910 when the American teachers, the Thomasites, founded the Aborlan Farm Settlement School for the Tagbanuas, one of the indigenous groups in the province of Palawan. Only after six years of its

establishment did its doors open to non- Tagbanuas. Its focus on agriculture led to its conversion to Aborlan Agricultural High School (AAHS) in 1928. It offered subjects such as Farm Arithmetic, Field Work, and Horticulture. It also offered Literature, Composition, and Physical Education. Eventually, in 1960, the AAHS was converted into a national regional agricultural school and became known as the Palawan National Regional Agricultural School (PNRAS) by virtue of RA 2619.





Since PNRAS served largely the province of Palawan, it was renamed Palawan National Agricultural School (PNAS) in 1962. A year after, on June 22, 1963, PNAS was converted into the Palawan National Agricultural College (PNAC) by virtue of RA 3648. Its conversion authorized PNAC to offer courses leading to associate degrees in agriculture and agricultural education, bachelor degrees in agriculture, agricultural

education, home economics, and also Master of Science with majors in agricultural sciences and Master of Agricultural Education.



It was during this time when PNAC internationally established the awarded Bayanihan School Program, a recipient of the Pro Patria Award and the Ramon Magsaysay Award, in recognition of the services it rendered to more than 2,000 out of school youth and farmers through the Bayanihan in Barong-barong, Abo-abo, Centers Calasaguen, and Samariñana in Brooke's Point; Magsaysay and San Jose in Dumaran; Bucana, Sibaltan, and Teneguiban in El Nido; Candawaga in Rizal; Antipuluan, Princess

Urduja, Calategas, and Malatgao in Narra; Salvacion in Puerto Princesa City;

Aramaywan, Quinlogan, and Tagusao in Quezon; Mendoza and San Jose in Roxas; and Abongan, Busybees, and Magsaysay in Taytay. These Bayanihan Centers were the forerunners of the present national high schools in the said areas.

Palawan National Agricultural College was converted to State Polytechnic College of Palawan (SPCP) on May 25, 1995 by virtue of RA

8012. It further authorized

SPCP to offer other courses in arts, sciences and technology, and other courses that are consistent with local, regional, and national development. On March 5, 2004, SPCP was



converted to a full-fledged university with the enactment of RA 9260 and became Western Philippines University (WPU). More relevant courses were offered; professional development of its faculty and staff was revitalized; and new and stronger linkages with partner institutions were established.

In 2013, WPU was recognized by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCUP), Inc. as one of the Top Performing SUCS based on the number of programs awarded accreditation status by levels.

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In 2015, in recognition of its environmental advocacy, WPU won awards from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and Commission on Higher Education. The University was a National Finalist and declared Regional Winner in the National Search for Sustainable and Ecofriendly Schools in MIMAROPA Region (Tertiary Level) and also received the MERALCO Energy Leadership Award- the same awards it previously won in 2013, 2015 and 2017 and Nestle Water Leadership Award- the same award it won in 2017. In 2017, WPU was finally recognized as a national winner for grabbing the Second Place in the nationwide competition. In 2019, WPU received the award "2019 Most Sustainable and Eco-Friendly School for MIMAROPA.



Major milestones were achieved when Puerto Princesa City Campus was designated as a Center of Excellence in Fisheries and as a National College/University of Fisheries (NUCF) while the Main Campus was designated as National College/University of Agriculture (NUCA). WPU was also designated as Regional Center for Information and Communications Technology, Regional Center for Vermiculture and Vermimeal Production, Affiliated Renewable Energy Center (AREC) and Provincial Center for Human Rights Education by the Commission on Higher Education and Commission on Human Rights.

WPU has gone a long way in its more than one hundred years of existence. From being a humble farm settlement school in 1910, WPU has evolved into a prime mover, a leader, in sustainable development in Western Philippines and beyond through relevant instruction, research, and extension services. Its name has become synonymous with environmental protection and green technology, enabling more people to lead a better life.

Western Philippines University shall primarily provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction, and training in the fields of agriculture, fisheries, forestry, engineering, environment, education, arts and sciences, rural development and other relevant fields of study. It shall also promote research and extension services and provide progressive leadership in its areas of specialization (Section 2, R.A. 9260).




Organizational Structure

Areas of Service

The Main Campus of Western Philippines University is located in Aborlan, Palawan. It has a major campus in Puerto Princesa City which offers courses in fisheries and aquatic biology. In response to requests from local government units to provide higher education to their constituents, WPU established campuses in Quezon (2003), Busuanga (2003), Culion (2003) and El Nido (2004). There are two extension schools: Rio Tuba in Bataraza (2004) and Canique in Taytay (2011); three training centers: Quinlogan in Quezon, Calasaguen in Brooke's Point, and Mangingisda in Puerto Princesa City; and one marine research station in Binduyan, Puerto Princesa City.

Academic Affairs






Enrollment and Graduation Trends

As to the enrollment for the First Semester of AY 2020-2021, 9,610 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 619 in the graduate and eight in the post-baccalaureate with a total of 10, 237 enrollees. While for the Second Semester of AY 2020-2021, 8,834 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 555 in the graduate and 11 in the post-baccalaureate with a total of 9,400.






The figure below shows the enrollment in the last five years. The data show that the enrollment in 2016 was 5,932 and 4,941 in 2017. The enrollment in the two successive years declined due to the implementation of the K to 12 Curriculum where the graduates of Junior High School are required to go through Senior High School before they can proceed to college. The enrollment increased again to 6,902 in 2018 and 8,821 in 2019. This is because the first batch of graduates of the Senior High School started to enroll in college. It can also be seen that the enrollment in 2020 increased by 401.



The number of graduates from 2017 to 2021 ranged from 1,183 to 50. In 2020 and 2021, it fell dramatically due to the Covid-19 pandemic.





Performance in Board Examinations


In 2021, the passing rate of WPU graduates in some of the licensure examinations was higher than the national passing rate. The University had produced three national topnotchers in the three licensure examinations given by the Professional Regulation Commission, to wit: Top 5 in Agricultural and Biosystems Engineer Licensure Examination, Top 8 in the Social Work Licensure Examination and Top 9 in the Fisheries Technologist Licensure Examination.

Student Services

The Office of Student Affairs and Services (OSAS) is responsible for promoting students' welfare and development. It was established to deliver basic services which will lead to the harmonious existence of a physical, social and emotional atmosphere conducive to the academic pursuits of the students. The office also serves as bridge between the students and the administration. The Director for Student Affairs and Services, who is designated by the President and confirmed by the Board of Regents, manages, supervises, and coordinates with the different sections.

The CHED emphasizes that the academic support services are: those that relate to student welfare, student development and those that relate to institutional programs and services. Student Welfare Services are basic services and programs needed to ensure and promote well-being of students. Student Development Services refer to the services and programs designed for the exploration, enhancement and development of the student's full potential for personal development, leadership and social responsibility through various institutional and student-initiated activities. Institutional Student Programs and Services refer to the services and programs designed to pro-actively respond to the basic health, food, shelter, and safety concerns of the students including students with special needs and disabilities and the school.

In the AY 2021, WPU SAS Continuity Plan was formulated by every SAS Unit. A workshop on formulation of the Continuity Plan was spearheaded by this Office with the assistance of the VPAA. The final output of the plan was submitted to CHEDRO Mimaropa

WPU Guidebook 2021 "Navigating the University in Times of Pandemic", the Student Handbook version during pandemic times, was completed and made possible through the committee composed of OSAS, Registrar's Office and Information Office with the Cooperation of the different SAS units in the university. The e copy of the Guidebook was sent to all students through the students' email.

Student Satisfaction Survey on SAS Programs of Western Philippines University was conducted in 2021. The result of the study was presented to the heads of the SAS units during the workshop. The research was published in European Journal of Research Development and Sustainability (EJRDS) Vol.2 No. 9, September 2021).

Library Services

The Library has been maintaining its Five-Year Library Strategic Plan. Through this, the Library was able to set priorities, focus energy and scarce resources on what is only needed in operation, strengthen the weakest areas, and ensure that employees and other stakeholders worked toward common goals. Moreover, it helped establish agreement around intended outcomes/results and assess and adjust the organization's direction in response to a changing environment.

Moreover, in commitment to its purpose, the Library conducted several activities to assist the community's information needs. Indeed, online information services were the frontrunner of the library services, namely Library Phone Reference Assistance, Library Online Reference Assistance, and Document Delivery Services. Although there were still clients who visited the Library physically, control through the Library Online Appointment was implemented to observe the social distancing protocol.

During pandemic time alone, the client's library usage increased compared to last year (2020). A shred of evidence that somehow, the implementation of new library services was strengthened; perhaps, clients were already aware of these services. In terms of library marketing, libraries heightened their library promotion through social media platforms and by displaying posters in public places in their community. It is also evident in the increase of Library Facebook followers.






