## **Executive Summary**

The year 2022 was the third year of the four-year term of Dr. Julie Hope Timotea P. Evina as the Third President of the Western Philippines University. It is her dream for WPU to soar to greater heights by harnessing opportunities for progress and excellence. She believes that this can be achieved through the following development goals: Attain academic excellence; Continuous upgrading of facilities; Sustain implementation of human resource development programs; Sustain advocacy for green initiatives among faculty, staff and students; Sustain prominence in research, innovation, and extension towards sustainable development; Preparing to move towards Industry 4.0; and Achieving AmBisyon 2040 through higher education.

## **Academic Affairs**

WPU maintains its seven colleges namely: College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), College of Agriculture, Forestry and Environmental Sciences (CAFES), College of Business and Management (CBM), College of Criminal Justice Education (CCJE), College of Education (CEd), College of Engineering and Technology (CET), and College of Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences (CFAS).

WPU offers three doctorate degrees, eight master's degrees, 22 undergraduate degrees, one post baccalaureate and one pre-baccalaureate. Some of the programs are offered in external campuses.

During the AY 2022, 33 programs being offered in the different campuses were evaluated by the AACCUP Accreditors. The results of the accreditation showed that five programs were Level 1 Accredited; 15 were Level 2 Re- accredited; 11 were Level 3 Re-accredited; and two were Level 4 Re-accredited.

As to the enrollment for the First Semester of AY 2021-2022, 11,993 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 544 in the graduate and 11 in post baccalaureates with a total of 12,548 enrollees. While for the Second Semester of AY 2021-2022, 10,732 were enrolled in the undergraduate, 460 in the graduate and 14 in the post baccalaureate with a total of 11, 206.

The Office of Student Affairs and Services (OSAS) is responsible for promoting students' welfare and development. It was established to deliver basic services which will lead to the harmonious existence of a physical, social and emotional atmosphere conducive to the academic pursuits of the students. The office also serves as bridge between the students and the administration.

In 2022, the Office of Student Affairs and Services had received several awards and recognitions. Among these are:

The guidance office plays a crucial role in providing support and assistance to students in various aspects of their academic, personal, and social lives.

The scholarships and financial assistance programs provide invaluable support to students, helping them achieve their educational goals. It helps in establishing a strong mechanism for the improvement of the scholarship services, plans out and implements effective guidelines for the scholarship services of the university, maintains records, submits reports to partner agencies, and addresses scholars' concerns promptly.

The Health Services Division serves the university by providing assistance to the WPU students, faculty and staff through medical, dental, and nursing services given to the WPU community.

The University Library services were reconsidered and revamped to fill the gaps and address the community's information needs during the limited face-to-face classes in the new normal. These challenges were the focus of the library operation as it geared towards the completion of the 2022 library services cycle. Indeed, some services were restructured, while others were sustained and strengthened.

In 2022, there is an increase in the statistics of library usage. One of the factors for this increase is students were already attending limited face-to-face

classes; thus, they were also permitted to use the library physically again. Although increases in usage are observed, other services usage decreased. These services are related to the online ways or services designed during the pandemic, like Document Delivery Service and Library Online and Phone Reference Assistance.

## **Research and Development**

In 2022, WPU had come up with 55 internally funded researches.

In 2022, the University had presented a total of 54 papers in different research fora. 21 of these papers were presented in international fora, 10 in national fora, 10 in regional fora and 13 in local level.

For the year 2022, WPU had published 40 researches in different publications.

## **Extension Services**

In 2022, through the seven colleges, WPU had conducted a total of 104 trainings and trained 3,425.5 trainees weighted by the length of training.

## **Administration and Support Services**

The total budget of WPU in 2022 was PhP 493,760,210.23. The budget allocated for Personal Services (PS) was PhP 250,351,736.28, for Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) was PhP 208,239,017.28 and for Capital Outlay was PhP 35,178,456.95.

At the end of 2022, WPU had 38 infrastructure projects being implemented through the Physical Plant Office.

For the Calendar Year 2022, the Western Philippines University had the Income Generating Projects and Auxiliary Projects. There were two categories under each project-the agriculture-based projects, and non-agriculture-based projects. The Income Generating Projects and Auxiliary Projects earned a gross income of PhP 6,356,408.39 with a net income of PhP 3,765,740.44.

There was a total of 369 faculty members and 342 staff members who composed the university workforce in 2022. As to the status of employment of faculty, 220 were permanent and 149 were non-permanent. For the status of employment of the staff, 128 were permanent and 214 were non-permanent.

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# About the University

## Brief History

Western Philippines University traces its history back to 1910 when the American teachers, the Thomasites, founded the Aborlan Farm Settlement School for the Tagbanuas, one of the indigenous groups in the province of Palawan. Only after six years of its establishment did its doors open to non- Tagbanuas. Its focus on agriculture led to its conversion to Aborlan Agricultural High School (AAHS) in 1928. It offered subjects such as Farm Arithmetic, Field Work, and Horticulture. It also offered Literature, Composition, and Physical Education. Eventually, in 1960, the AAHS was converted into a national regional agricultural school and became known as the Palawan National Regional Agricultural School (PNRAS) by virtue of RA 2619.



Since PNRAS served largely the province of Palawan, it was renamed Palawan National Agricultural School (PNAS) in 1962. A year after, on June 22, 1963, PNAS was converted into the Palawan National Agricultural College (PNAC) by virtue of RA 3648. Its conversion authorized PNAC to offer courses leading to associate degrees in agriculture and agricultural education, bachelor degrees in agriculture, agricultural education, home economics, and also Master of Science with majors in agricultural sciences and Master of Agricultural Education.

It was during this time when PNAC established the internationally awarded Bayanihan School Program, a recipient of the *Pro Patria Award* and the *Ramon Magsaysay Award*, in recognition of the services it rendered to more than 2,000 out of school youth and farmers through the Bayanihan Centers in Barong-barong, Abo-abo, Calasaguen, and Samariñana in Brooke's Point; Magsaysay and San Jose in Dumarán; Bucana, Sibaltan, and Teneguiban in El Nido; Candawaga in Rizal; Antipuluan, Princess Urduja, Calategas, and Malatgao in Narra; Salvacion in Puerto Princesa City; Aramaywan, Quinlogán, and Tagusao in Quezon; Mendoza and San Jose in Roxas; and Abongan, Busybees, and Magsaysay in Taytay. These Bayanihan Centers were the forerunners of the present national high schools in the said areas.

Palawan National Agricultural College was converted to State Polytechnic College of Palawan (SPCP) on May 25, 1995 by virtue of RA 8012. It further authorized SPCP to offer other courses in arts, sciences and technology, and other courses that are consistent with local, regional, and national development. On March 5, 2004, SPCP was converted to a full-fledged university with the enactment of RA 9260 and became Western Philippines University (WPU). More relevant courses were offered; professional development of its faculty and staff was revitalized; and new and stronger linkages with partner institutions were established.

In 2013, WPU was recognized by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACCCUP), Inc. as one of the Top Performing SUCS based on the number of programs awarded accreditation status by levels.

In 2015, in recognition of its environmental advocacy, WPU won awards from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and Commission on Higher Education. The University was a National Finalist and declared Regional Winner in the National Search for Sustainable and Eco-friendly Schools in MIMAROPA Region (Tertiary Level) and also received the MERALCO Energy Leadership Award- the same awards it previously won in 2013, 2015 and 2017 and Nestle Water Leadership Award- the same award it won in 2017. In 2017, WPU was finally recognized as a national winner for grabbing the Second Place in the nationwide competition. In 2019, WPU received the award “2019 Most Sustainable and Eco-Friendly School for MIMAROPA.





Major milestones were achieved when Puerto Princesa City Campus was designated as a Center of Excellence in Fisheries and as a National College/University of Fisheries (NUCF) while the Main Campus was designated as National College/University of Agriculture (NUCA). WPU was also designated as Regional Center for Information and Communications Technology, Regional Center for Vermiculture and Vermimeal Production, Affiliated Renewable Energy Center (AREC) and Provincial Center for Human Rights Education by the Commission on Higher Education and Commission on Human Rights.

WPU has gone a long way in its more than one hundred years of existence. From being a humble farm settlement school in 1910, WPU has evolved into a prime mover, a leader, in sustainable development in Western Philippines and beyond through relevant instruction, research, and extension services. Its name has become synonymous with environmental protection and green technology, enabling more people to lead a better life.

## Mandate

Western Philippines University shall primarily provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction, and training in the fields of agriculture, fisheries, forestry, engineering, environment, education, arts and sciences, rural development and other relevant fields of study. 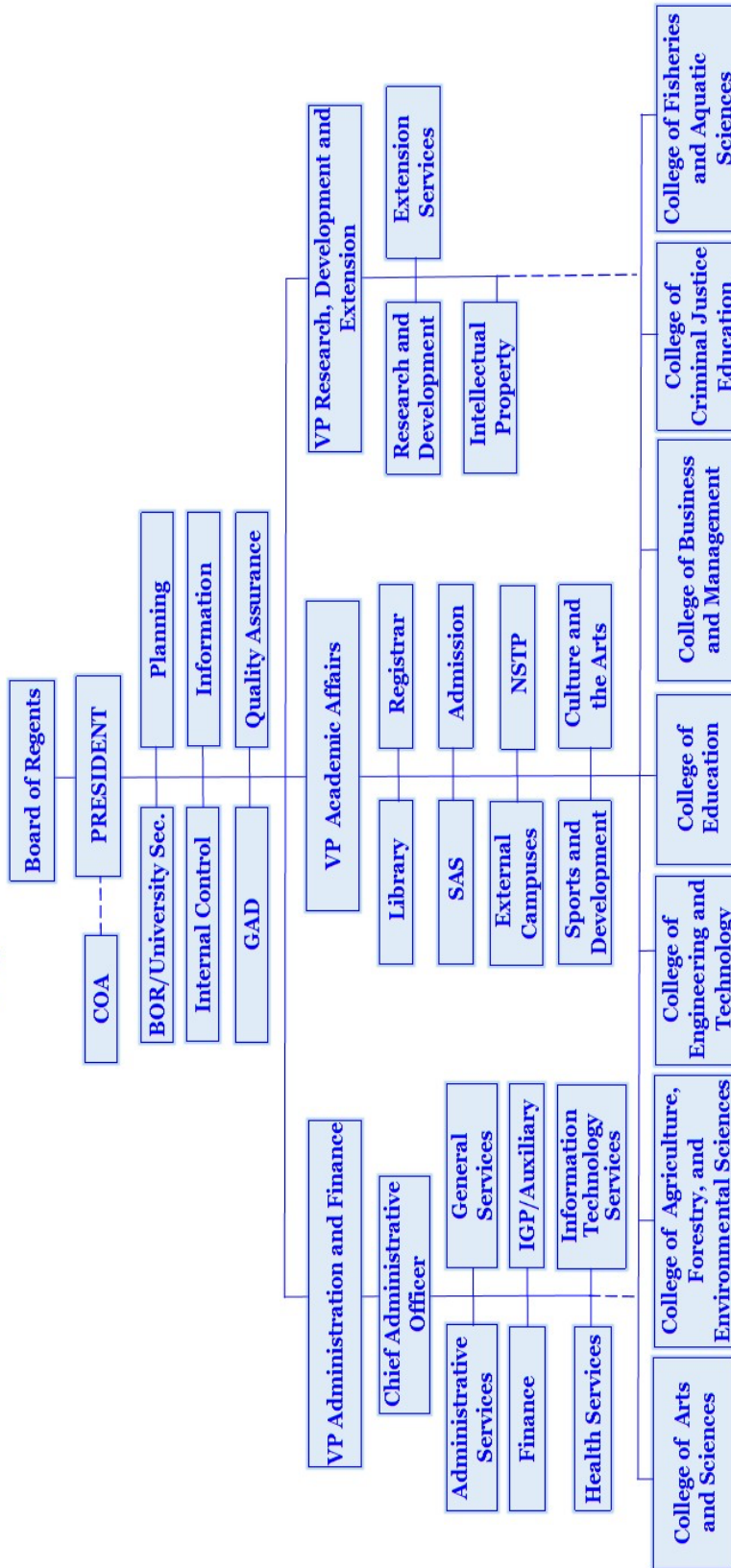

# Organizational Structure

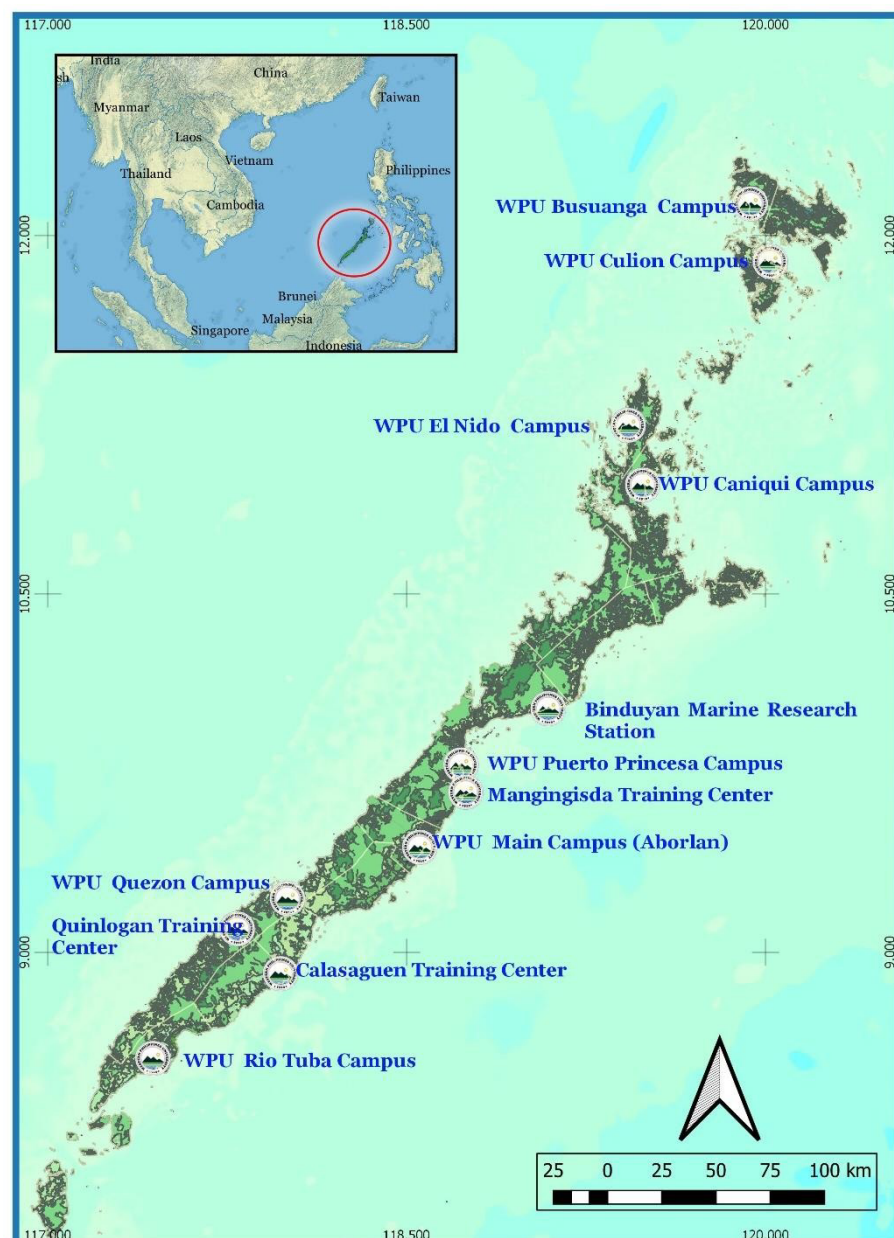
## WPU Organizational Structure

## Areas of Service

The Main Campus of Western Philippines University is located in Aborlan, Palawan. It has a major campus in Puerto Princesa City which offers courses in fisheries and aquatic biology. In response to requests from local government units to provide higher education to their constituents, WPU established campuses in Quezon (2003), Busuanga (2003), Culion (2003) and El Nido (2004). There are two extension schools: Rio Tuba in Bataraza (2004) and Canique in Taytay (2011); three training centers: Quinlogan in Quezon, Calasaguen in Brooke's Point, and Mangingisda in Puerto Princesa City; and one marine research station in Binduyan, Puerto Princesa City.

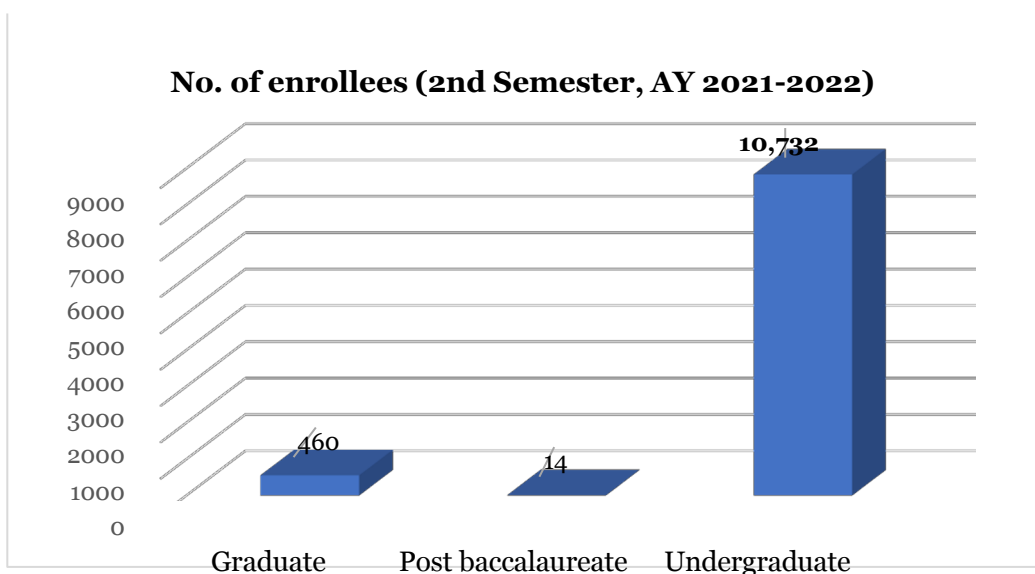
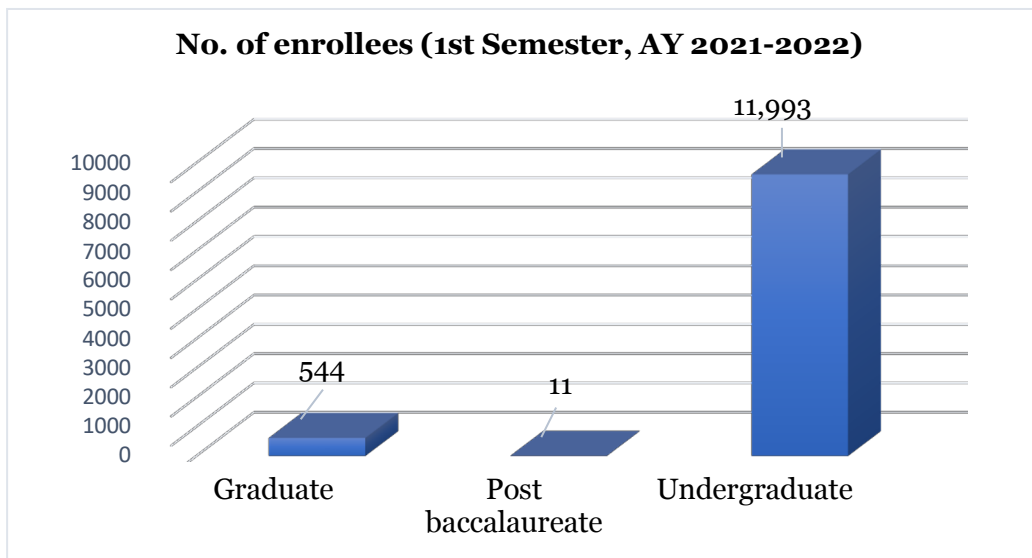

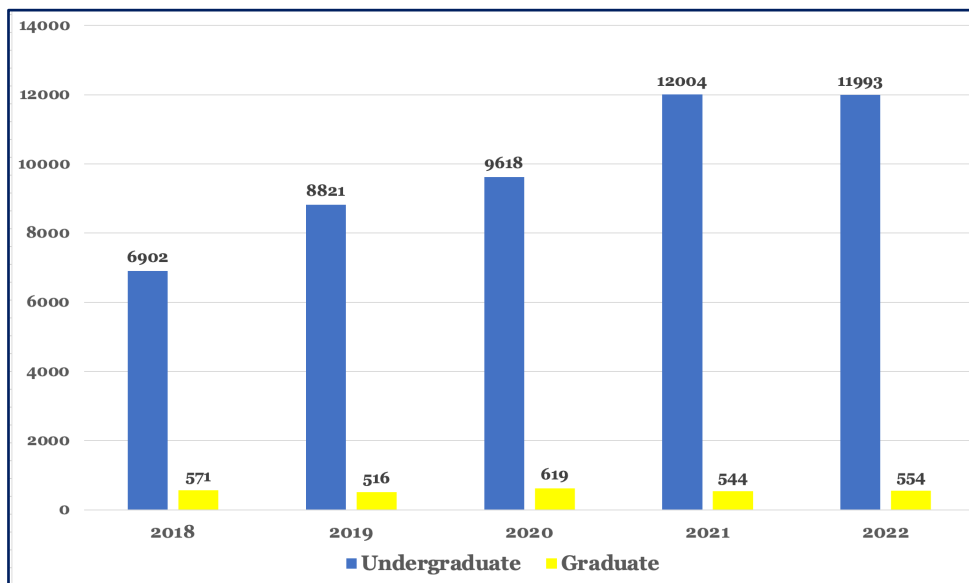
## Enrollment and Graduation Trends

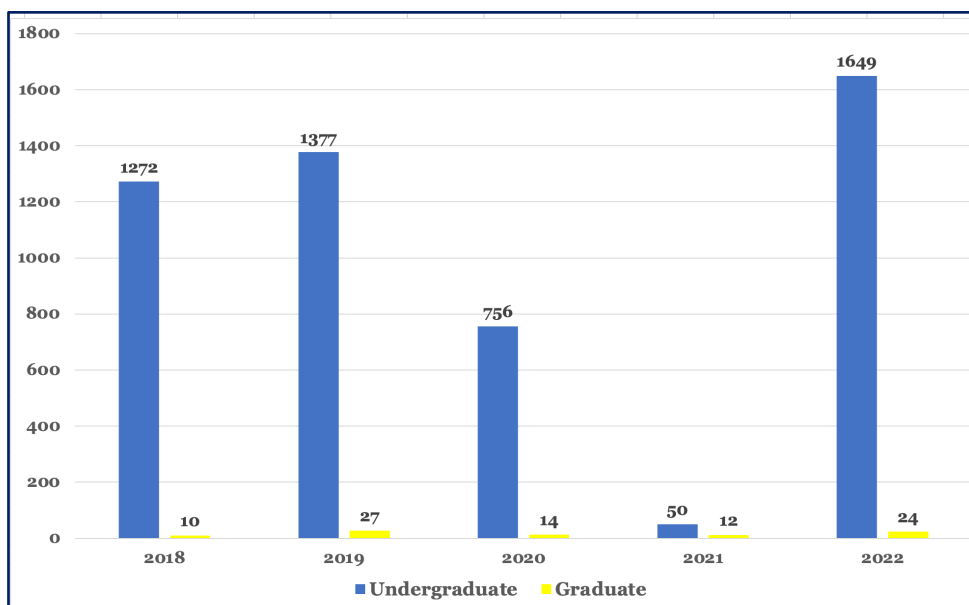




The figure below shows the enrollment of WPU in the last five years. It can be noted that the enrollment had consistently increased for the past five years.

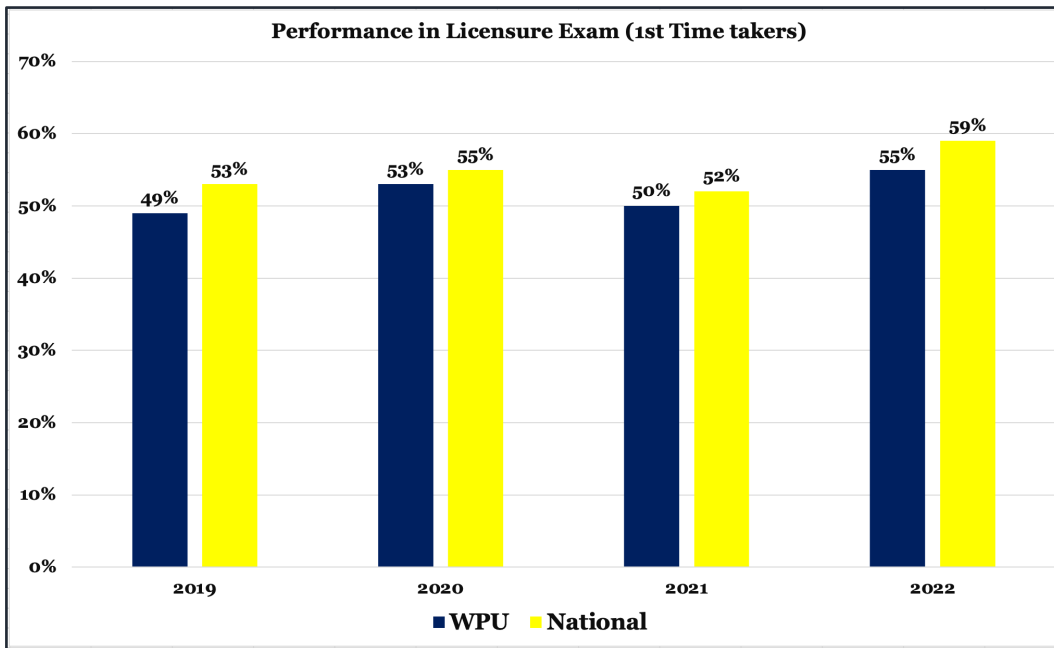


The figure below shows the number of graduates from 2018 to 2022. It can be seen that in 2020 and 2021, it fell dramatically due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

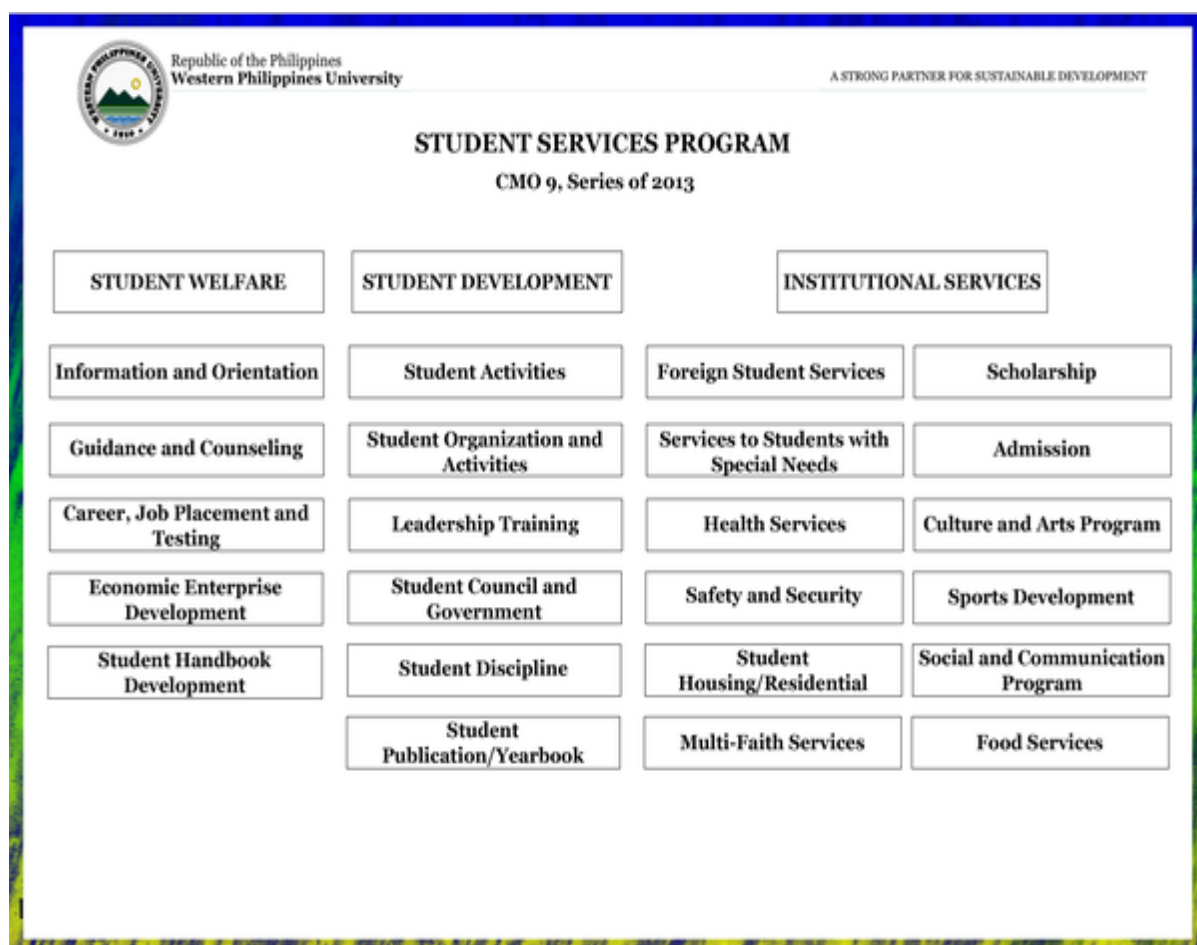

- As service provider to students, the office was able to cater two hundred seven thousand five hundred sixty-nine (207,569) student inquiries/concerns as is frontline services, eleven thousand one hundred eleven (11,111) clients for student welfare services.
- The Student Publication was able to release Olympics Tabloid Special Issues 1 and 2; ;maintain online presence through Official Facebook page; successfully recruit of 17 to 33 total members of the Organization; publish articles through online platform amidst pandemic; and submit new processes for ISO 9001:2015 accreditation.

### **Information and Orientation Services**

The Information and Orientation services was provided to the students through the different online platforms. The Virtual Orientation for the first semester of the school year 2022-2023 was conducted on September 29, 2022.

## **Career and Job Placement Services**

From the beginning, the Career Center is devoted to its fundamental role as the premiere provider of career advocacy and employment services not only in the University, but the local community and the province. It supports students in their adjustment to university life and career paths through various information campaigns, seminars, one-on-one consultations, programs, and activities, thus assisting them in self-evaluation of their own capabilities, inclinations, and individualities to help bring about a holistic and well-adjusted student development. Thus, WPUCC provides numerous prospects for student growth and advancement.

At the foreground, the Center consistently upholds partnerships with relevant offices and other significant agencies and individuals in order to effectively and efficiently address the students' needs and hardships. Through the years, WPUCC unfailingly and untiringly finds ways to improve and upgrade its services, tools, and instruments at hand to sustain and produce what the learners and clients deserve - delivery of the highest quality of service in the most efficient way possible.

In March of 2019, WPUCC is accredited by the Department of Labor and Employment – MIMAROPA as a Job Placement Office by virtue of a Memorandum of Agreement signed by both parties on March 27, 2019, at Puerto Princesa City.

As the Career Center and Job Placement Office of Western Philippines University, this Section handles matters related to the career and professional development of students. Specifically, it handles the career-related fundamentals and job placement programs and services of the university.

The Career Center has nine (9) major services - Academe-Industry Partnerships, Career Counseling and Advising, Testing, Career-Related Seminars, Career Volunteerism, Career and Job Fairs/PEOS, E-Portfolio, Advisory Board Meetings, and Job Placement Services. The Career Center prepares students from their first year through their last years and beyond, ensuring that they are educated on their strengths, weaknesses, and career options even after graduation.

Meanwhile, the Job Placement Office takes the students' preparedness further by guaranteeing that the students are provided with labor market information (LMI), job opportunities, and knowledge on employment laws and regulations at their fingertips. It sustains sixteen (16) services in partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment – MIMAROPA - Special Program for Employment of Students (SPES), Phil-JobNet, Job Fair, PESO Employment Information System (PEIS), Pre-Employment Orientation Seminars (PEOS), Special Recruitment Activity (SRA), Government Internship Program (GIP), Local Recruitment Activity (LRA), Tulong Panghanap-Buhay sa Atang Disadvantaged/Displaced Worker (TUPAD), Livelihood, National Skills Registry Program, Tulong Alalay sa Mga Taong May Kapansanan Program (Tulay), Pre-Departure Orientation Seminar (PDOS), Jobstart, Anti-Child Labor, and Anti-Illegal Recruitment and Trafficking in Persons (AIR-TIP).

## Library Services

In Western Philippines University Library, services were reconsidered and revamped to fill the gaps and address the community's information needs during the limited face-to-face classes in the New Normal. These challenges were the focus of the library operation as it geared forward to complete the 2022 library services cycle. Indeed, some services were restructured, while others were sustained and strengthened.

At the end of the year 2021, an evaluation of plans was done, as evident in the evaluated Office Performance Commitment and Review (OPCR) and Five-Year Library Development Plan. The said evaluation process made ways to re-formulate activities and re-scaling expected outputs/ outcomes and eventually became targets of the library for the year 2022.

With these re-calibrated services, 2022 results showed that there is an increase in the statistics of library usage. One of the factors for this increase is students were already attending limited face-to-face classes; thus, they were also permitted to use the library physically again. Although increases in usage are observed, other services' usage decreases. These services are related to the online ways or services designed during the pandemic, like Document Delivery Service and Library Online and Phone Reference Assistance.

Moreover, WPU Libraries conducted thirteen (13) activities this year. Most of these activities aim to promote the library's services, facilities, and collections. This year, the National Book Week celebration was the library's most coveted activity. The event was graced by the presence of the Vice President for Finance and the Director for Quality Assurance, who led the cutting of the ribbon during the opening program. The exhibit of new library materials was showcased under the Jurassic Era theme. Also, there were activities conducted daily. Likewise, the recycled fashion show was highlighted during the closing program of the said event.

Furthermore, personnel development was continuously emphasized this year, especially in terms of camaraderie, harmonization or unity, and addressing issues concerning the mental health of library personnel amidst the pandemic. Other than this, they also allowed to attend several seminars and training to improve their performance at work and other personal and professional developments.

In addition, the Library Manual was officially approved by the Library Advisory Board and is still in the process of revision by incorporating suggestions from the members. Issues and innovations concerning the library operation and personnel were tackled during their meeting. Also, ISO procedures and forms were revisited and revised.

Regarding Collection Development, the library was still working and striving to meet the compliance of CHED and AACUP. This action plan is also based on the Collection Development Plan of the Library. Additionally, there are new materials acquired by the libraries, some of which are from the donation. On the other hand, there are no materials subject to discarding this year.

Although face-to-face classes were already implemented, using facilities was still in the social distancing protocol, and signage was maintained to remind everyone about the risk of the virus, which became more advantageous for the library in eliminating noise and disturbances. However, returned books were quarantined, not for a week anymore but only for a day or 24 hours. Hygiene materials were still in place, like alcohol, foot bath, and hand washing areas.

Lastly, with the pandemic restrictions loosened, the library initiated re-formatting its services and re-scaling customer satisfaction. In every revision, the library considered new things and learned new things as well. Amidst this recent change of progression in the academe, the library never stops innovating or creating and re-creating new ways to improve its services for the welfare of students, faculty members, and the whole WPU community.
