

## Executive Summary

Western Philippines University achieved its goals and objectives for the year 2023 through the remarkable efforts and commitment of its leaders, Dr. Julie Hope Timotea P. Evina and Atty. Joselito C. Alisuag. Upon the retirement of Dr. Evina, Atty. Alisuag took over the position and was designated as Officer-in-Charge of the office of the President. These leaders led the University towards accreditation of courses to higher levels, revitalization of research, development and extension services, modernization of infrastructures, and invigoration of administrative and support services.

### Academic Affairs

- Through its seven colleges, WPU offered three (3) doctoral degrees, eight (8) master's degrees, 21 baccalaureate degrees, one (1) post-baccalaureate and four (4) pre-baccalaureate programs.
- A new program, Bachelor of Science in Information Systems was given a Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC) this year. Thus, it will be offered in the University for the next school year.
- The University has 27 programs accredited by Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACUP). Among these programs, three (3) were Level 1 Accredited; 13 were Level 2 Re-accredited; nine (9) were Level 3 Re-accredited and two (2) were Level 4 Re-accredited.
- WPU had 11,788 students for the first semester of AY 2023-2024, and 9,980 students for the second semester of AY 2023-2024.
- WPU had 2,448 graduates of undergraduate programs, and 24 graduates of graduate programs.
- The licensure exam performance of WPU in terms of passing rate, and the percentage of programs with performance above the national passing improved in the last five years.
- The licensure examination passing rate of WPU graduates of Bachelor of Science in Forestry, Bachelor of Elementary Education, Bachelor of Secondary Education, Bachelor of Science in Criminology, and Bachelor of Science in Fisheries was higher than the national passing rate.
- Ms. Alexis G. Sumbe, a WPU graduate, ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in the October 2023 Fisheries Technologist Licensure Examination with 85.50% rating.
- There were 18 WPU-funded and four (4) externally-funded scholarships/educational assistance available to students. For the second semester of the School Year 2023-2024, two (2) students availed WPU-funded scholarship

(academic). A total of 772 students availed externally funded scholarship during the first and second semester of School Year 2023-2024.

- Career guidance and counseling, testing, job placement, and consultation and information campaign services were provided to students and incoming freshmen.
- WPU's campus paper, The WPU Collegian, won major awards during the 17<sup>th</sup> MIMAROPA Regional Higher Education Press Conference 2023 held at Western Philippines University, Main Campus on May 29-31, 2023. Student journalists of both WPU Collegian and Tentacles bagged several awards in individual categories.
- There were 56 accredited student organizations in 2023. These organizations conducted 47 activities specified in their plans.
- The Supreme Student Council had 11 proposed projects with Php 9,207,000.00 budget from the 50% development enhancement fee.
- WPU was awarded Regional Best Job Placement Office during the First Regional DOLE-PESO Year-End Performance Assessment (YEPA) on March 8, 2023 at Summit Ridge Tagaytay City, Cavite.
- As part of the continuous enrichment of library resources, materials and equipment were acquired. A total of 1,083 library materials and 60 equipment were acquired for the Main Campus Library and 272 library materials and 11 equipment for Puerto Princesa Campus Library.
- WPU participated in the 7<sup>th</sup> STRASUC Culture and the Arts Festival 2023 held on October 16-22, 2023 at Occidental Mindoro State College, San Jose, Occidental Mindoro. WPU student artists bagged 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Painting and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Photo Contest.
- The Office of the Culture and the Arts had 13 internal performances and nine (9) external performances.

## **Research and Development**

- Forty-seven (47) research projects were completed in 2023.
- WPU researchers presented 53 papers.
- Two (2) researchers received research awards, one for best paper and the other one for best oral presentation.
- Thirty-two (32) research-based papers were published in international journals.
- The Palawan Scientist, an open-access, externally peer-reviewed, refereed research journal of WPU, released its 15<sup>th</sup> Volume in December, 2023. Articles published in the journal are indexed in the Philippine E-Journals, Google Scholar, and ASEAN Citation Index (ACI), Clarivate Analytics, Andrew Gonzalez Philippine Citation Index, and recently in EBSCO.
- Ten (10) research results were submitted for application for a patent and three (3) research results were submitted to apply for a utility model.

## Extension Services

- Twenty-six (26) extension programs approved by the Board of Regents were implemented in 2023.
- Through the seven colleges, 139 trainings were conducted with 5,224 persons trained weighted by the length of training.

## Administration and Support Services

- The total budget of WPU as per General Appropriation Act (GAA) 2023 was PhP430,412,789.71. The budget allocated for Personnel Services was PhP264,499,838.00, for Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) was PhP140,569,860.31, and for Capital Outlay (CO) was PhP25,343,091.40. The actual obligations for 2023 was PhP411,333,655.53 while the disbursement was PhP367,477,727.45.
- Twenty-five (25) infrastructure projects were implemented. By the end of 2023, 14 projects were completed and 11 were ongoing.
- The Income Generating Project (IGPs) and Auxiliary Services earned a gross income of PhP6,009,175.78 with a net income of PhP1,601,664.76.
- There were 724 personnel in 2023 composed of 374 faculty members and 350 staff.
- For faculty development, 11 faculty sponsored by WPU, through its faculty development program, were pursuing higher education and advanced education, while 12 faculty pursuing advanced education were granted scholarship by other agencies.
- Medical and dental services were provided to students, personnel, and visitors.
- WPU had been recommended for continued ISO 9001:2015 (Quality Management Systems) Certification for Management of Academic Affairs and Extension Services by SOCOTEC Certification Philippines, Inc.
- The University's Strategic Development Plan for 2023-2027 was approved as per BOR Resolution No. 864, Series of 2023.
- The University's Land Use and Infrastructure Plan was approved as per BOR Resolution No. 852, Series of 2023.
- The University submitted an application to the Times Higher Education (THE) as first step to attain international recognition, highlight the University's areas of excellence and identify areas for development

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# About the University

## Brief History

Western Philippines University traces its history back to 1910 when the American teachers, the Thomasites, founded the Aborlan Farm Settlement School for the Tagbanuas, one of the indigenous groups in the province of Palawan. Only after six years of its establishment did its doors open to non-Tagbanuas. Its focus on agriculture led to its conversion to Aborlan Agricultural High School (AAHS) in 1928. It offered subjects such as Farm Arithmetic, Field Work, and Horticulture. It also offered Literature, Composition, and Physical Education. Eventually, in 1960, the AAHS was converted into a national regional agricultural school and became known as the Palawan National Regional Agricultural School (PNRAS) by virtue of RA 2619.



Since PNRAS served largely the province of Palawan, it was renamed Palawan National Agricultural School (PNAS) in 1962. A year after, on June 22, 1963, PNAS was converted into the Palawan National Agricultural College (PNAC) by virtue of RA 3648. Its conversion authorized PNAC to offer courses leading to associate degrees in agriculture and agricultural education, bachelor degrees in agriculture, agricultural education, home economics, and also Master of Science with majors in agricultural sciences and Master of Agricultural Education.



It was during this time when PNAC established the internationally awarded Bayanihan School Program, a recipient of the Pro Patria Award and the Ramon Magsaysay Award, in recognition of the services it rendered to more than 2,000 out of school youth and farmers through the Bayanihan Centers in Barong-barong, Abo-abo, Calasaguen, and Samariñana in Brooke's Point; Magsaysay and San Jose in Dumaran; Bucana, Sibaltan, and Teneguiban in El Nido; Candawaga in Rizal; Antipuluan, Princess Urduja, Calategas, and Malatgao in Narra; Salvacion in Puerto Princesa City; Aramaywan, Quinlogan, and Tagusao in Quezon; Mendoza and San Jose in Roxas; and Abongan, Busybees, and Magsaysay in Taytay. The

Banihan Centers were the forerunners of the present national high schools in the said areas

Palawan National Agricultural College was converted to State Polytechnic College of Palawan (SPCP) on May 25, 1995 by virtue of RA 8012. It further authorized SPCP to offer other courses in arts, sciences and technology, and other courses that are consistent with local, regional, and national development. On March 5, 2004, SPCP was converted to a full-fledged university with the enactment of RA 9260 and became Western Philippines University (WPU). More relevant courses were offered; the professional development of its faculty and staff was revitalized; and new and stronger linkages with partner institutions were established.



In 2013, WPU was recognized by the Accrediting Agency of Chartered Colleges and Universities in the Philippines (AACUP), Inc. as one of the Top Performing SUCs based on the number of programs awarded accreditation status by levels.

In 2015, in recognition of its environmental advocacy, WPU won awards from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources and Commission on Higher Education. The University was a National Finalist and declared Regional Winner in the National Search



for Sustainable and Eco-friendly Schools in MIMAROPA Region (Tertiary Level) and also received the MERALCO Energy Leadership Award-the same awards it previously won in 2013, 2015 and 2017 and Nestle Water Leadership Award-the same award it won in 2017. In 2017, WPU was finally recognized as a national winner for grabbing the Second Place in the nationwide competition.

Major milestones were achieved when Puerto Princesa City Campus was designated as a Center of Excellence in Fisheries and as a National College/ University of Fisheries (NUCF) while the Main Campus was designated as National College/University of Agriculture (NUCA). WPU was also designated as Regional Center for Information and Communications Technology, Regional Center for Vermiculture and Vermimeal

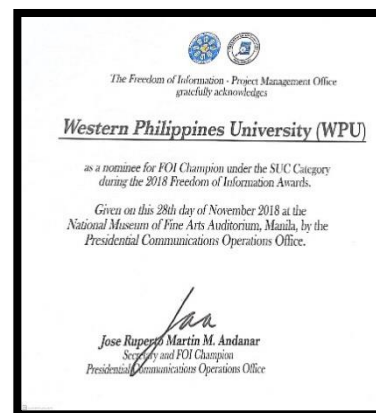


Production, Affiliated Renewable Energy Center (AREC) and Provincial Center for Human Rights Education by the Commission on Higher Education and Commission on Human Rights.

In 2018, WPU was one of the two SUCs recognized as Freedom of Information (FOI) implementation champion by the Presidential Communications Operations Office (PCOO). A certificate of compliance with the set of Freedom of Information (FOI) requirements was awarded to the University in 2021.



To ensure the quality of services being offered, WPU undergone assessment conducted by SOCOTEC Certification Philippines, Inc. In the year 2019, WPU was awarded the ISO 9001:2015 Certificate for the University’s General Administration and Support Services (GASS) and Research Services and issued a re-certification in 2021. The Management of Academic Affairs and Extension Services earned ISO 9001:2015 certification in 2021 and certificate of attestation was issued in 2023.



WPU has gone a long way in its more than one hundred years of existence. From being a humble farm settlement school in 1910, WPU has evolved into a prime mover, a leader, in sustainable development in Western Philippines and beyond through relevant instruction, research, and extension services. Its name has become synonymous with environmental protection and green technology, enabling more people to lead a better life.

## Mandate

Western Philippines University shall primarily provide advanced education, higher technological, professional instruction, and training in the fields of agriculture, fisheries, forestry, engineering, environment, education, arts and sciences, rural development and other relevant fields of study. 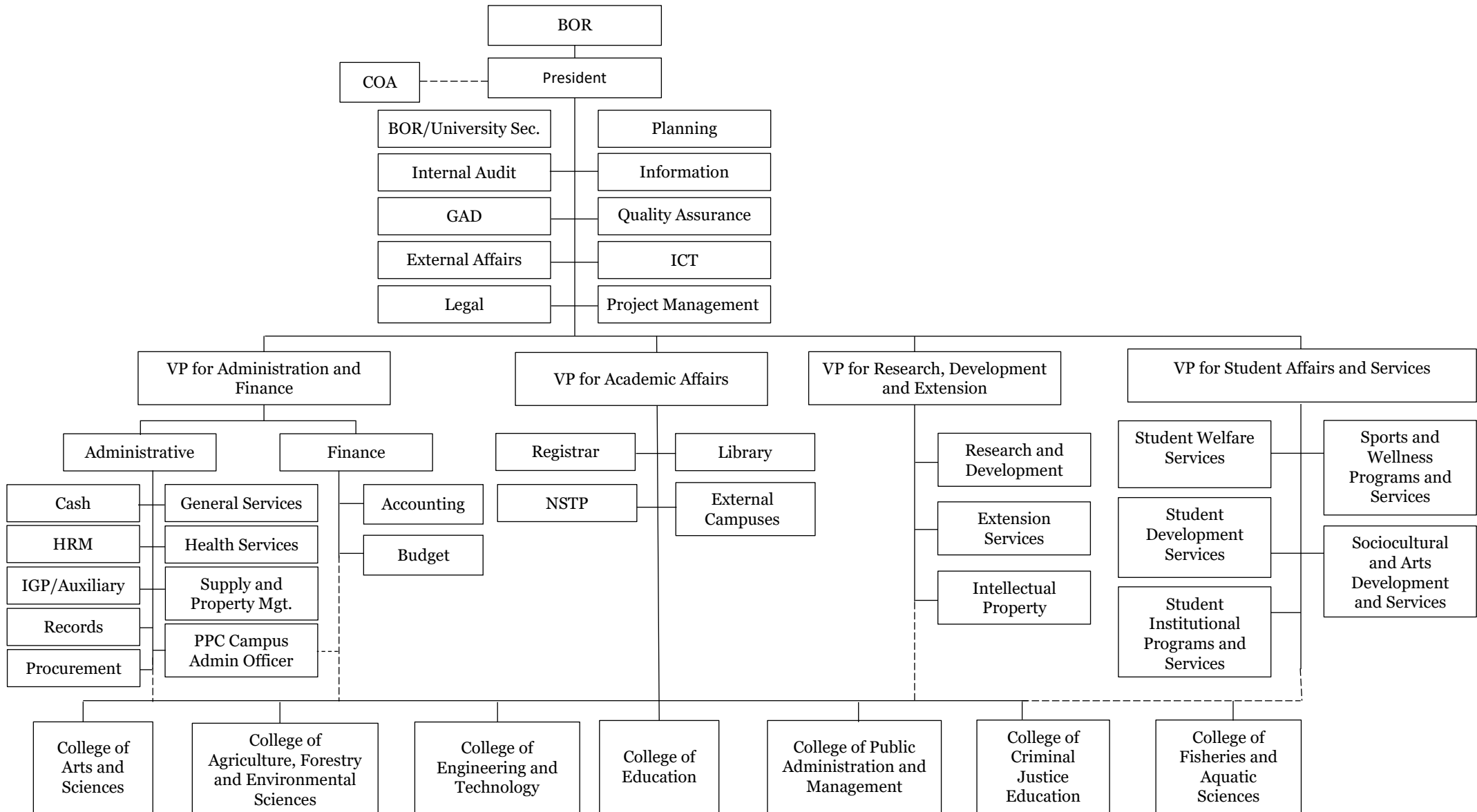

# Organizational Structure



## Areas of Service

The Main Campus of Western Philippines University is located in Aborlan, Palawan. It has a major campus in Puerto Princesa City which offers courses in fisheries and aquatic biology. In response to requests from local government units to provide higher education to their constituents, WPU established campuses in Quezon (2003), Busuanga (2003), Culion (2003) and El Nido (2004). There are two extension schools: Rio Tuba in Bataraza (2004) and Canique in Taytay (2011); three training centers: Quinlogan in Quezon, Calasaguen in Brooke's Point, and Mangingisda in Puerto Princesa City; and one marine research station in Binduyan, Puerto Princesa City.

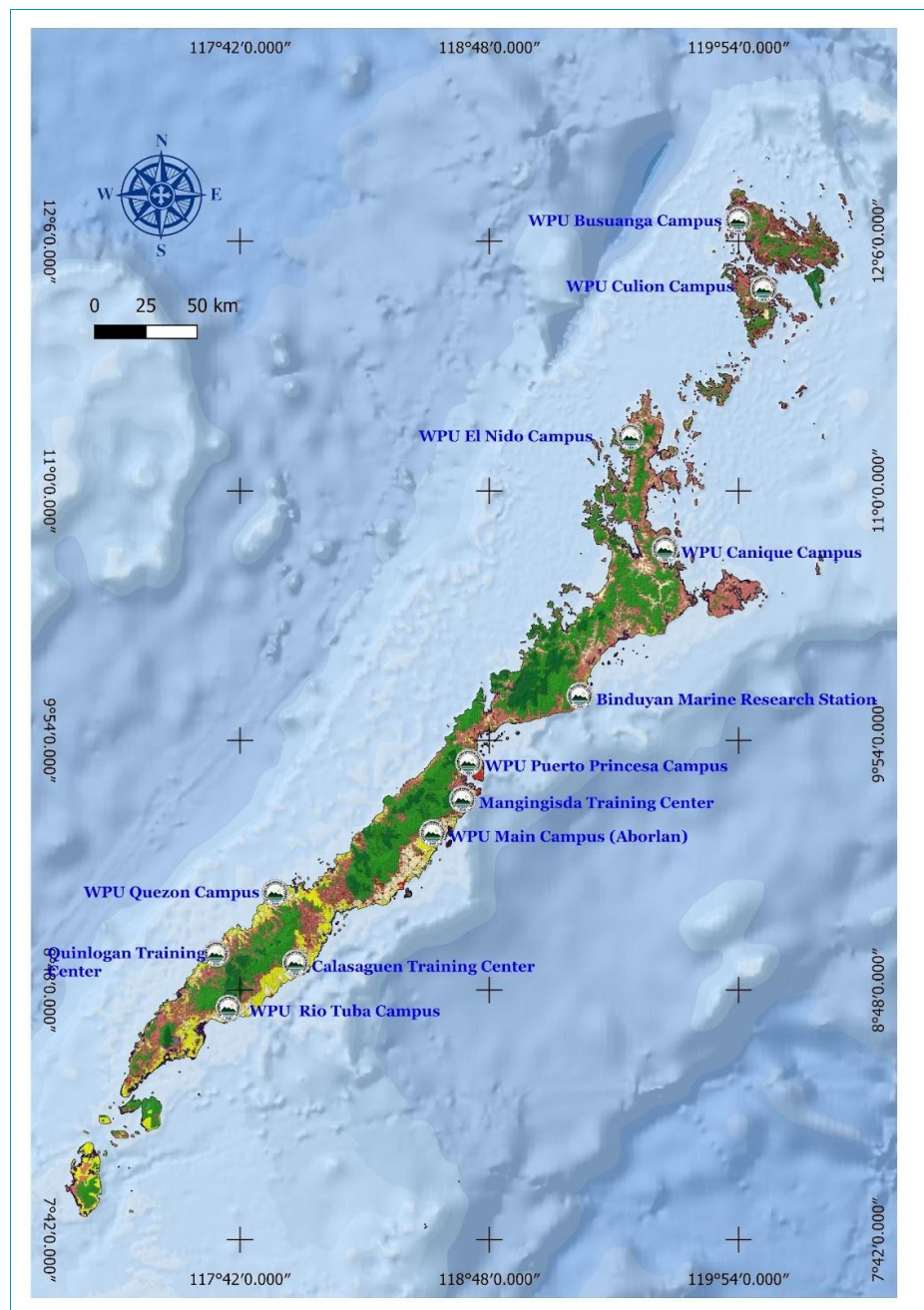


Figure 2. Map of Palawan indicating the areas of service of WPU

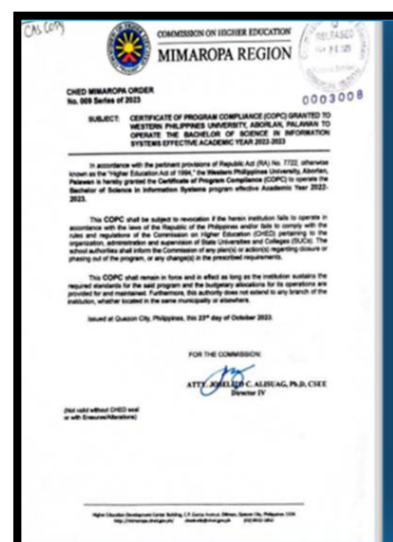

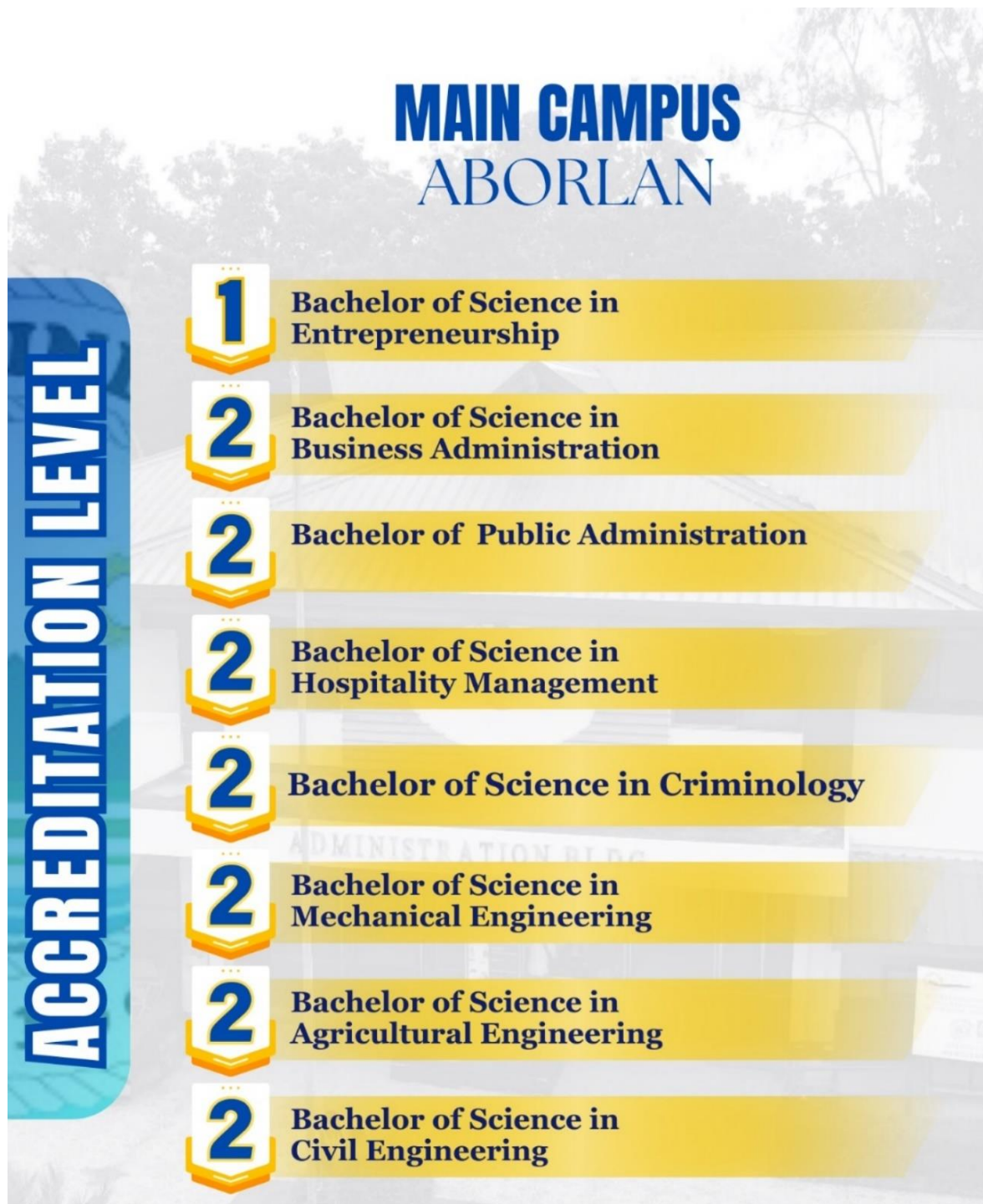
### New Program Offering

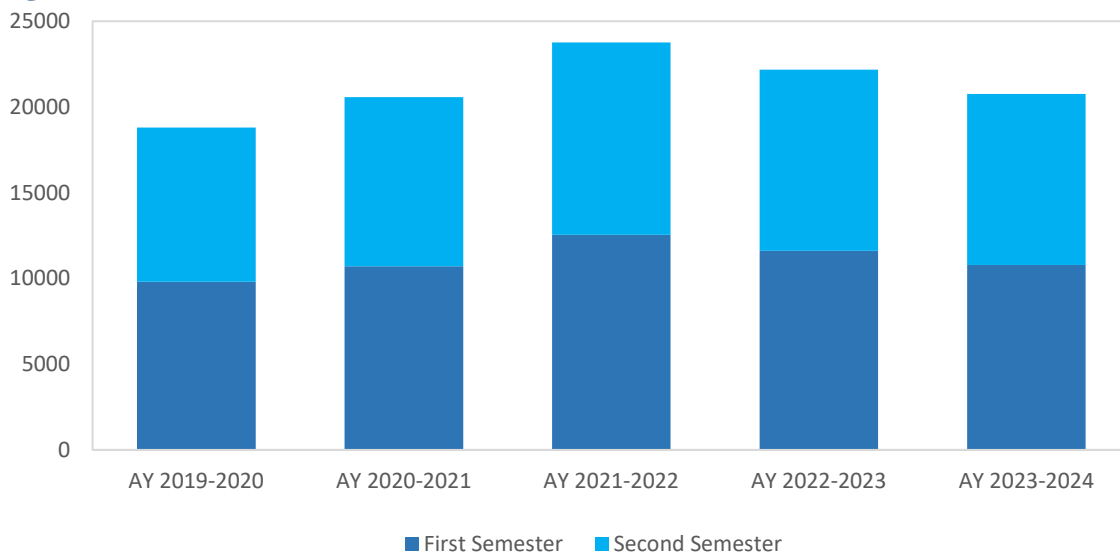

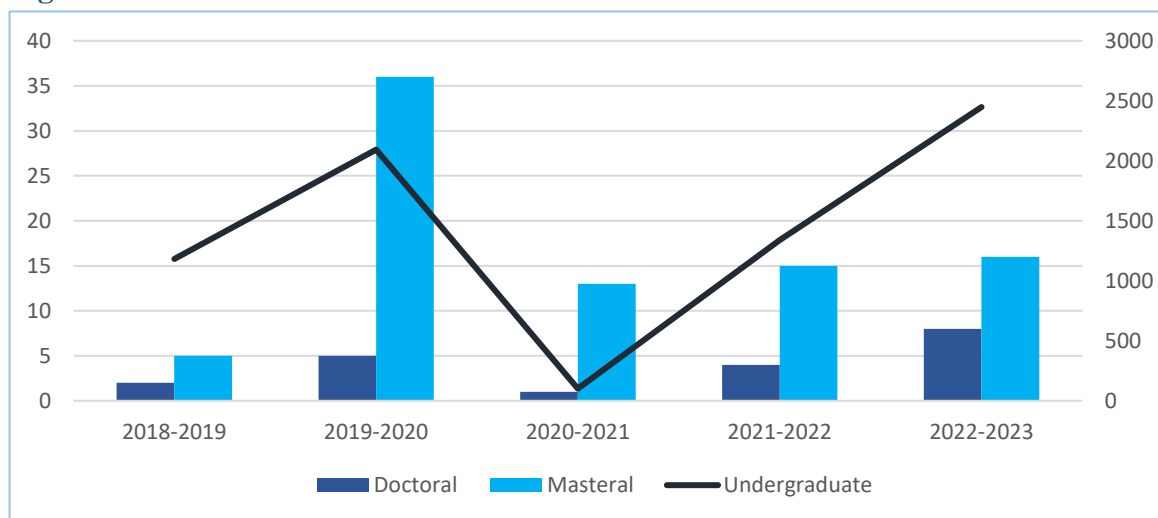
**Figure 3. Enrolment Data for the Last Five Years**

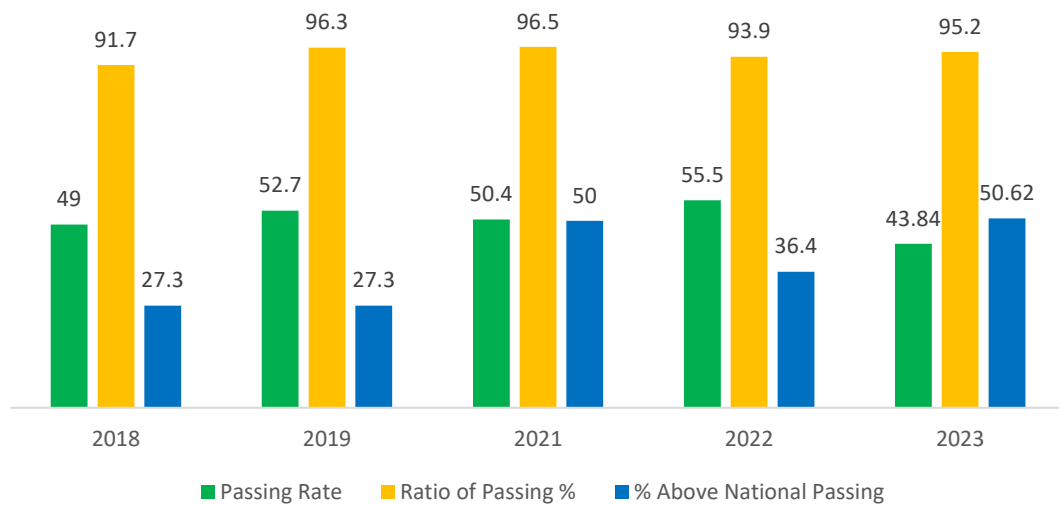
**Figure 4. Graduation Data for the Last Five Years**



## Licensure Examination Performance

The licensure exam performance of WPU in terms of passing rate, and the percentage of programs with performance above the national passing improved in the last five years. In 2023, the University produced a topnotcher (Top 5<sup>th</sup>) in Licensure Examination for Fisheries Professionals. In 2020, licensure exams for programs offered by WPU were cancelled or rescheduled by the Professional Regulation Commission due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

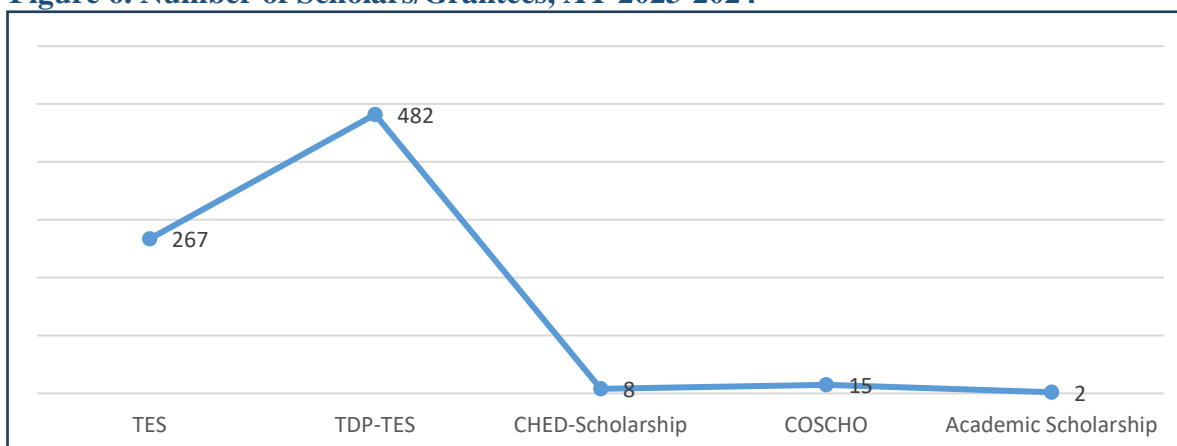

**Figure 6. Number of Scholars/Grantees, AY 2023-2024**

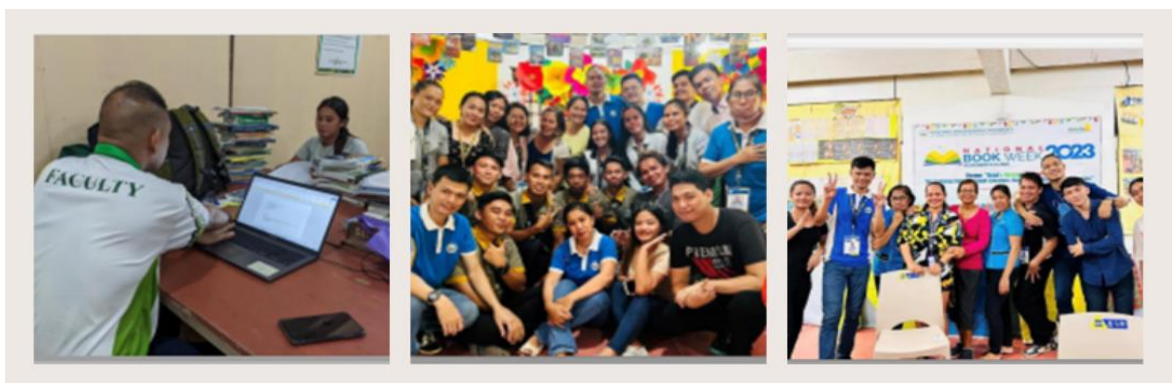


### Library Services

The following are the accomplishments of the library for the year 2023.

- The library participated actively in the University's accreditation and monitoring exercises of 14 academic programs and audit visits of two (2) campus libraries, the Busuanga and Culion.
- A group of librarians conducted a cataloging caravan to visit and organize the materials of other campus libraries with no licensed librarians.
- The library established another computer application system to track the usage of materials per section.

- University libraries were able to accommodate 72,375 students, 1,004 faculty members and staff, and 95 outside researchers. Also, they were able to loan out 11,212 books and periodicals.
- Puerto Princesa Campus and Main Libraries served 1,116 clients through the library's e-services.
- The library strengthened its marketability by constantly promoting the library and its services on social media. With that, 2,235 additional social media followers are tracked.
- Linkages were strengthened by establishing partnerships with other university libraries in the province and other regions through a memorandum of agreement and journal exchange.
- As part of the continuous enrichment of library resources, materials and equipment were acquired. A total of 1,083 library materials and 60 equipment were acquired for the Main Campus Library and 272 library materials and 11 equipment for Puerto Princesa Campus Library.

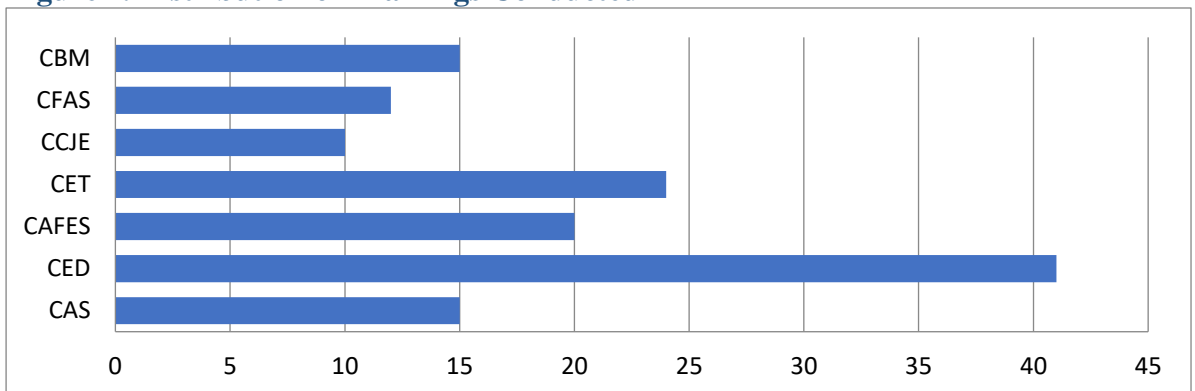

## Trainings Conducted

The total budget of WPU as per General Appropriation Act (GAA) 2023 was PhP430,412,789.71. The budget allocated for Personnel Services was PhP264,499,838.00, for Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) was PhP140,569,860.31, and for Capital Outlay (CO) was PhP25,343,091.40. The actual obligations for 2023 was PhP411,333,655.53 while the disbursement was PhP367,477,727.45.

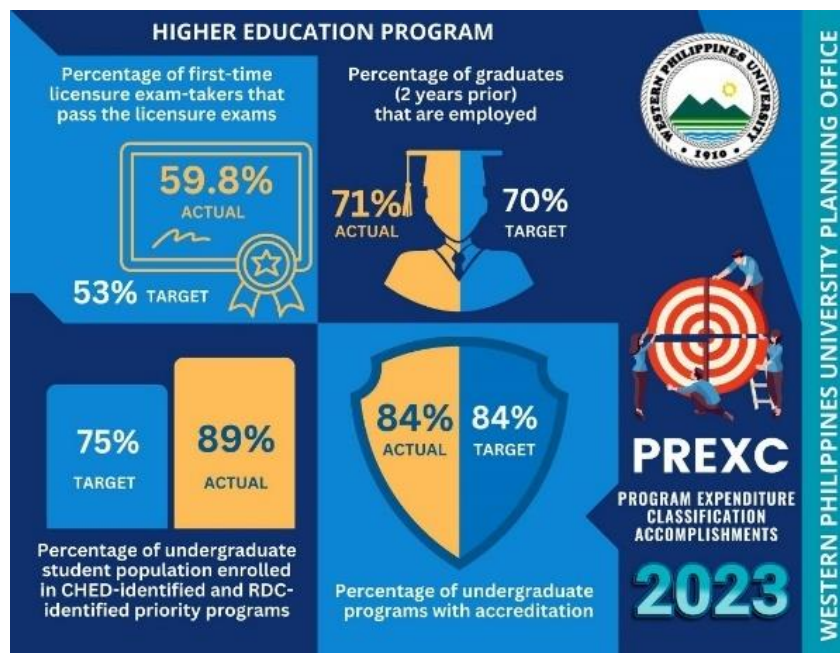

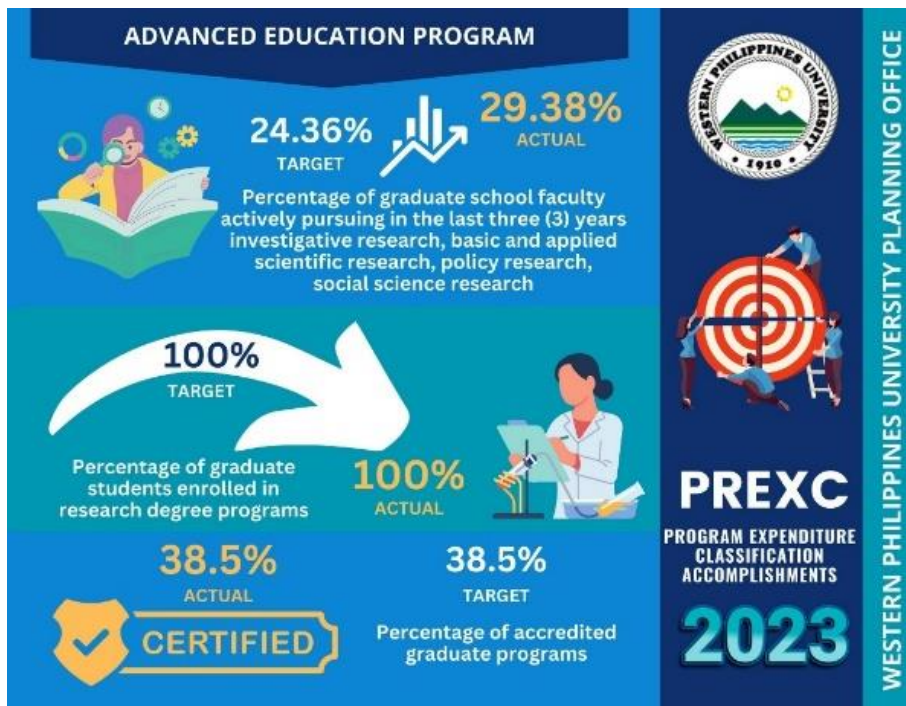

## Physical Accomplishment

The University met 100% (14/14) of its Congress-approved performance indicators and targets as published in the FY 2023 General Appropriations Act (GAA). The performance indicators and targets are grouped into four programs: Higher Education, Advanced Education, Research, and Technical Advisory Extension.



- For the “percentage of first-time licensure exam-takers that pass the licensure exams”, WPU surpassed its 53% target with an accomplishment of 59.8% (676/1,131). Among the board programs covered by WPU, LEPT-Elementary had the highest passing rate at 84.78%, followed by LEPT-Secondary at 81.50%.
  - *Note: WPU also had Top 5 in the October 2023 Licensure Examination for Fisheries Professionals*
- For the “percentage of graduates (2 years prior) that are employed”, WPU accomplished 71% (72/101) against the target of 70%.
  - *Note: low number of graduates 2 years prior (2021) due to COVID-19 pandemic*
- With regard to “percentage of undergraduate student population enrolled in CHED-identified and RDC-identified priority programs”, WPU accomplished 89% (9,281/10,422) against the target of 75%.
- WPU maintained its performance for the “percentage of undergraduate programs with accreditation” at 84% (27/32). Three programs (BSBA and BPA in Main Campus, and BS Entrepreneurship in PPC Campus) were subjected to accreditation survey visit in 2023 (still waiting for results from AACCUP).



- For the “percentage of graduate school faculty actively pursuing in the last three (3) years investigative research, basic and applied scientific research, policy research, social science research”, WPU accomplished 29.38% (57/194) against the target of 24.36%.
- All graduate programs of WPU are considered as research degree programs (i.e. have thesis/dissertation), hence WPU maintained its performance of 100% (316/316) graduate students enrolled in research degree programs.
- WPU maintained its performance for the “percentage of accredited graduate programs at 38.5% (5/13). Three programs (MSESM and MSRD in Main Campus, and PhD Educational Administration in PPC Campus) were subjected to accreditation survey visit in 2023 (still waiting for results from AACCUP).



- With regard to the “number of research outputs in the last three years utilized by the industry or by other beneficiaries”, WPU met its 1 target. WPU was able to provide its beneficiary (Tagumpay Agrarian Auto-Savings-Multipurpose Cooperative) with the process on development and improvement of dehydrated mango product, mango vinegar, and mango wine, as well as the packaging designs of these products.
- The performance for the “number of research outputs completed within the year” was driven by WPU’s partnerships and collaborations. WPU’s accomplishment for this indicator was 47 against the target of 35.
- WPU’s partnerships and collaborations also helped improve the performance for the “percentage of research outputs published in internationally-refereed or CHED recognized journal within the year”. WPU’s accomplishment was 25% (26/103) against the target of 18%.



- WPU was able to sustain its performance of 29 active partnerships with LGUs, industries, NGOs, NGAs, SMEs, and other stakeholders as a result of extension activities.
- For the “number of trainees weighted by the length of training”, WPU surpassed its target of 4,425 with an accomplishment of 5,224. The quantity of trainings attained was a product of the training activities that resulted from partnerships and collaborations.
- With regard to the “number of extension programs organized and supported consistent with the SUC's mandated and priority programs”, WPU accomplished 26 against the target of 20 programs.
- WPU was able to continue maintaining its performance for the “percentage of beneficiaries who rate the training course/s and advisory services as satisfactory or higher in terms of quality and relevance”. WPU’s accomplishment was 99.98% (4,529/4,530).

## Infrastructure Development

WPU implemented 25 infrastructure projects with a total amount of PhP 149,467,460.38. By the end of 2023, 14 projects were completed and 11 were ongoing.

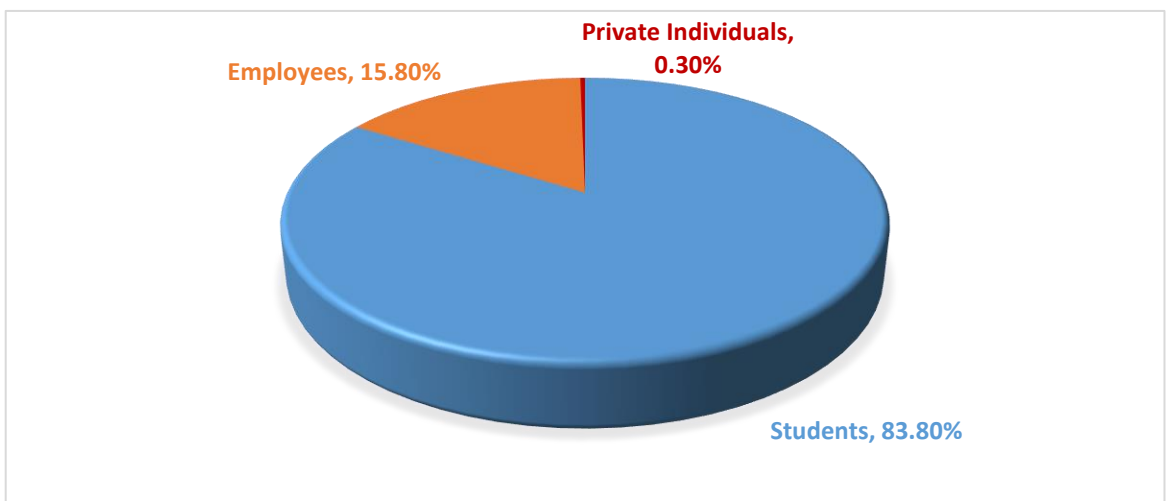


## Health Services

The health services of WPU provided medical and dental services to students, personnel, and visitors. Among the clients who availed health services, 83.8% were students; 15.8% were employees; and 0.3% were private individuals.

The medical services provided include physical examination, consultation, work and school activity-related injuries, blood pressure assessment, body mass index assessment, blood typing assessment, medical certificate issuance, referral, giving medicine to the recipient, pregnant client consultation and persons with disability assessment. The dental services provided included dental examination, consultation, dental extraction, and oral prophylaxis.

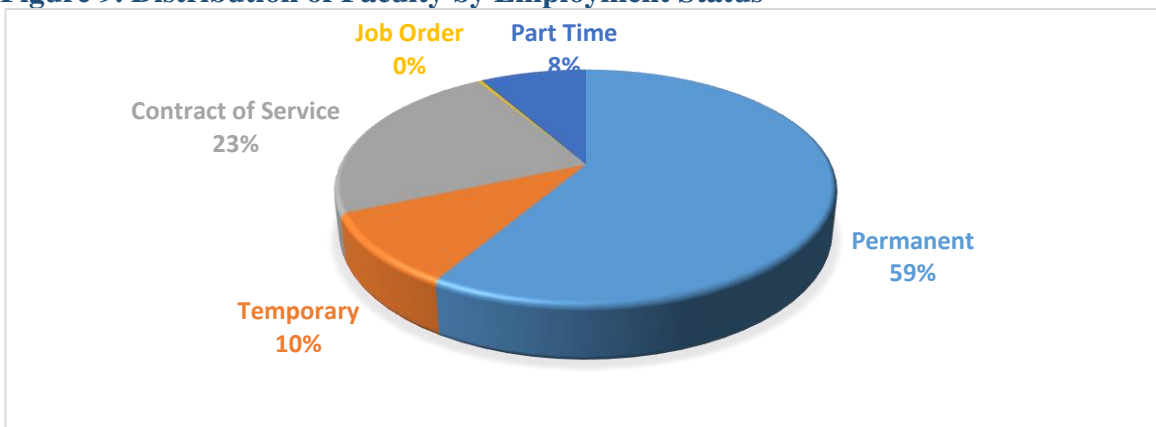

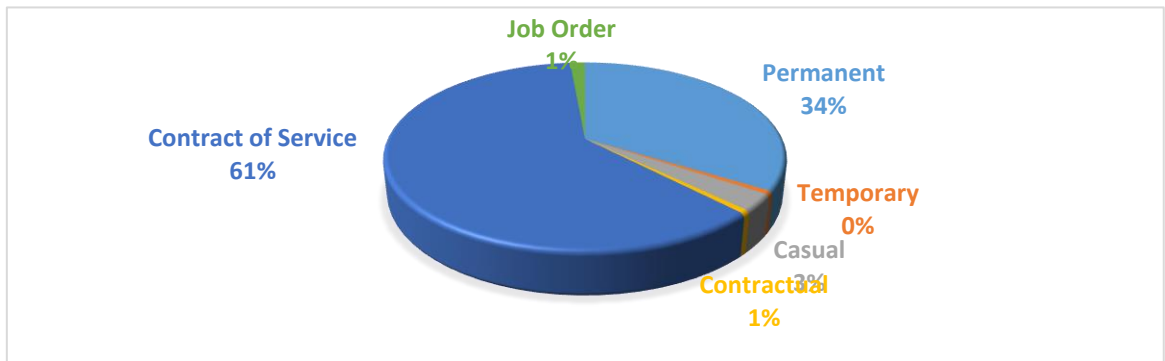
### Employment Status of Faculty and Staff

**Figure 9. Distribution of Faculty by Employment Status**



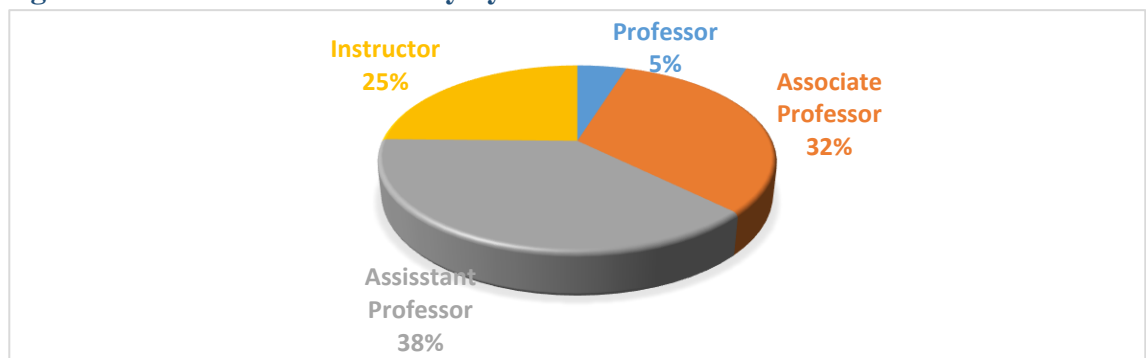
**Figure 10. Distribution of Staff by Employment Status**

The University faculty members were composed of eight (8) professors; 54 associate professors; 63 assistant professors; and 41 instructors.

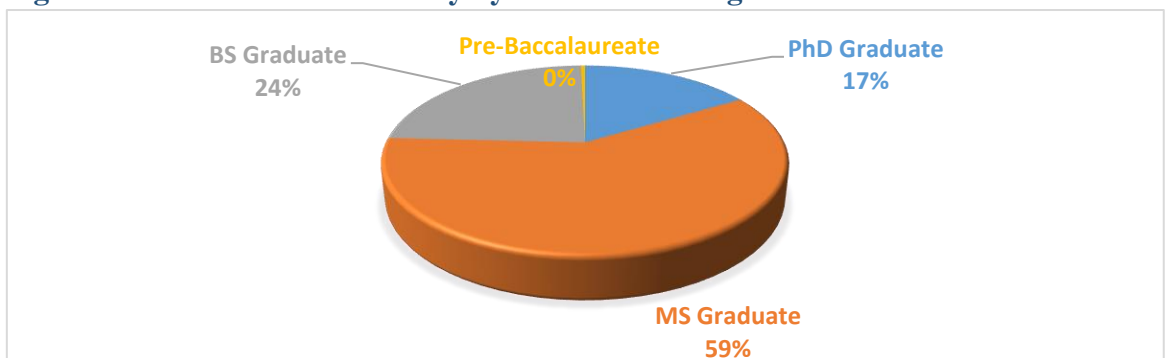
**Figure 11. Distribution of Faculty by Academic Rank**

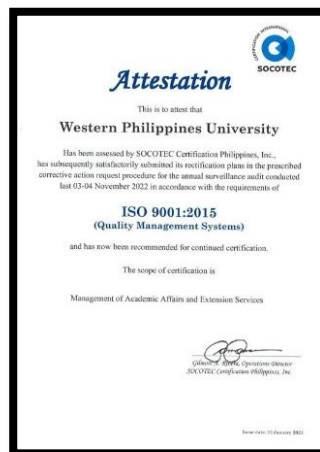

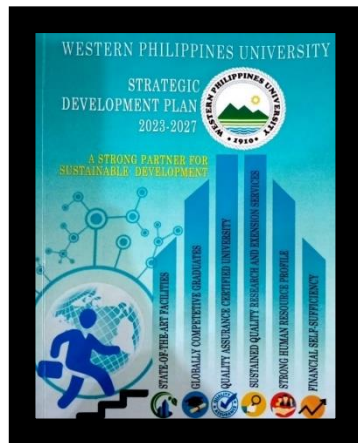

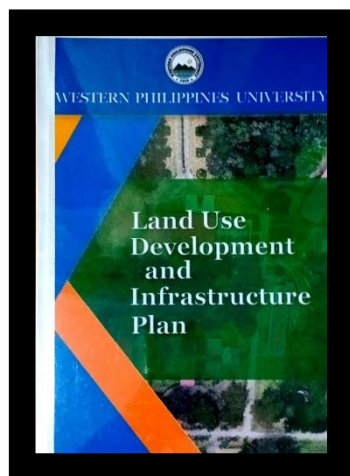
